

## Community Grants Program

### Quick Grants

Twenty-three (23) eligible applications were received in the first round of 2023-24 Quick Grants. These were reviewed by the CEO and 22 applications were approved on 25 October 2023 with a total value of \$10,397.04.

Grants for \$500 were awarded to the following:
