Blue Sky Festival

The Glen Forrest Christmas Gathering is held on 23 December in Burkinshaw Park, Glen Forrest. The Hills Youth Choir, made up of volunteers aged eight to 18 from the local area, leads the event.

The park is set up with facilities including sausage sizzle, coffee truck, ice cream truck and sales of glow ware used for the carols. There are some games organised for the children and Santa arrives on a fire truck and throws lollies. There is an annual tug-o-war and after sunset the carols being.
