- Engagement with the community leading into the season (i.e. Social media campaigns, sharing of information, continuity in the content shared, appropriate sources used to gain information, etc.)

An update will be given by the Shire on its mitigation activities, upcoming grant monies, mitigation projects currently underway, and any community engagement being undertaken as a result of these.

#### **CBFCO/CESM REPORT**

#### PREVENTION.

Shire of Mundaring is currently in the open burning period, while the risk of bushfires is
currently low, the colder weather has led to an increased risk of structure fires. As
temperatures drop, the use of heaters, fireplaces, and other heating devices becomes more
common, which can contribute to a higher incidence of house fires.

#### PREPAREDNESS.

- Dual mobilisation remains in place for Wooroloo and Chidlow
- While we have recently received some much-needed rain, it is predicted that our burning period may still be cut short due to the potential for temperatures to rise before we can complete our burns. This presents several challenges in meeting our burning targets:
  - Weather Variability: The unpredictable weather patterns can limit the windows of opportunity for safe and effective burning.
  - Resource Allocation: Ensuring we have sufficient resources, including personnel and equipment, ready and available during these short periods is crucial.
  - Safety Concerns: The rising temperatures may increase the risk of fire outbreaks, making it essential to prioritise safety for all involved.
  - Environmental Conditions: Changing environmental conditions, such as increased dryness and wind, can complicate planned burns and necessitate adjustments to our strategies.
  - Community Impact: Balancing the need for controlled burns with the potential impact on nearby communities requires careful planning and communication.

We must remain flexible and prepared to adapt our plans as conditions change. Continuous monitoring and assessment will be key to navigating these challenges and ensuring the safety and effectiveness of our burning efforts.

SUBJECT: Mundaring Firefighters School Report to BFAC, August 2024

DATE: 1 August 2024

The following items were discussed at the last VBFSTAG meeting:

- The development of new skills cards for initial incident management, six of which have been developed for review, not sure of their current status.
- The development of a simple HAZMAT Incident awareness course for BFBs who may attend in a support role, or who may come across a HAZMAT incident when responding to something else, i.e. truck or shed fire.
- Tree Hazard Awareness Course online course ongoing development.
- UXO Awareness Course online course accessible now on eAcademy.
- Ground Controller Course addition of a practical element Comms exercise.
- Ground Observer Course Being trialled, due to be published soon.
- Still waiting for an update on the ICV Training Package.
- EV Fire training for first responders is needed, especially in the Regions.

There was a combined training advisory group workshop/forum in April, this brought together all the training advisory groups, BFS, VFRS, VFES, SES and VMRS for some updates from DFES, eAcademy and discussions around volunteer training generally.

The main topics of discussion were:

- RPL/RCC Processes
- IIR Process
- On-Line Induction Training
- Volunteer Hub Updates

The blended Bushfire Safety Awareness Course has been released, we have not run it yet and have had some feedback that some instructors, whilst supportive of the online concept are concerned that the face-to-face time has been reduced too much. This is the first course anyone does, and it is important that we get the students into the correct mind-set for being a bushfire volunteer.

We will be reviewing the online content with all BSA TAs to look at the course and see if we want to include it in next year's calendar.

The new WA Emergency Management Training Academy is transitioning into the next phase. Land has been procured and the Project Action Team, that I sit on, has been re-activated to finalise the Business Case for final funding from Treasury.

The focus is on making training accessible to volunteers, including on-site accommodation so regional members get to use it. It will benefit us through improved access to the training props, so watch this space.

Finally, please make sure that you get your members nominated on courses, we generally have plenty of places available. I will continue to send out a list of nomination numbers and places available for upcoming course every month or sq.
