4.0 RESPONSE TO PREVIOUS PUBLIC QUESTIONS TAKEN ON NOTICE

4.1 Question Taken on Notice - Ordinary Council Meeting 8 April 2025 - Eric Smith

At the Ordinary Council meeting held 8 April 2025, Mr Eric Smith of Glen Forrest asked a question which was taken on notice. A response was provided to Mr Smith by the Chief Executive Officer in writing. Below is a summary of the questions and the response provided.

Question 1

What has been the total cost of hiring traffic controllers for the Shire from 2003 – 2024? Total cost of street sweeping equipment for both hired and Shire equipment for the 23/24? Total cost of footpath cleaning for 23/24?

Response

The total annual expenditure for traffic controllers under the current contractor is as follows. Extracting historical data from the financial system requires considerable officer time; however, with the introduction of the new chart of accounts in 2020/21, this information is now readily accessible. As a result, we have conducted a review of the data dating back to 2019/20.

• **2024/25** (to date): \$705,605

2023/24: \$783,588
2022/23: \$1,012,457
2021/22: \$849,307
2020/21: \$732,475
2019/20: \$617,487

Additionally, the expenditure for footpath sweeping in 2023/24 was \$139,704, while the total cost for street sweeping (including both hired services and Shire-operated plant/staff) in 2023/24 was \$407,679.

4.2 Question Taken on Notice - Ordinary Council Meeting 13 May 2025 - Christian Jackson-Stegner

At the Ordinary Council meeting held 13 May 2025, Mr Christian Jackson-Stegner of Chidlow asked a question which was taken on notice. A response was provided to Mr Jackson-Stegner by the Chief Executive Officer in writing. Below is a summary of the questions and the response provided.

Question 1

How do the Shire IT officers make sure that rate and resident data will be saved from hackers and third parties? Can you explain officially the software and hardware solutions and how do you identify the origin developers and/or Countries for AI support and if they are safe?

Response

The Shire prioritises information security, ensuring sensitive data access is restricted to authorised personnel based on organisational needs. Our security policies follow the Australian Cyber Security Centre's Essential Eight strategies, safeguarding data from cyber threats. A thorough risk assessment ensures third-party systems don't compromise our network. Additionally, staff training on AI best practices and data security strengthens awareness and compliance across the organisation.

4.3 Question Taken on Notice - Ordinary Council Meeting 13 May 2025 - Eric Smith

At the Ordinary Council meeting held 8 April 2025, Mr Eric Smith of Glen Forrest asked a question which was taken on notice. A response was provided to Mr Smith by the Chief Executive Officer in writing. Below is a summary of the questions and the response provided.

Question 1

Why don't all Shire vehicles at the Administration Building have Shire logos on them?

Response

Most Shire vehicles are clearly marked with official logos to ensure easy identification. However, some vehicles serve dual purposes and are designated for both commuting and private use. In such cases, Shire logos are not applied to these vehicles allowing them to be used in a manner that suits their intended function while maintaining flexibility for their drivers.

1.	After many questions and motions put to the Shire about a bus shelter for those that use the bus stop on Great Eastern Highway at the end of Daleview Close, Glen Forrest pathway, there has all of a sudden appeared a pathway from Chittawarra Court to the proximity of the covered bus stop. Was this a new pathway or was it one that was suddenly found and cleared of much overgrowth, and so that the access can be made to this bus shelter, whilst in the meantime those that use the bus stop in Daleview Close pathway have to suffer all weather conditions? What happened?	This question was taken on notice
2.	With respect to the response I received from the CEO and the cost of street cleaning etc, how many hours does the sweeper spend on cleaning the streets? How many hours does the sweeper spend in the workshop for maintenance, repairs and downtime as against the cost of using a contractor?	This question was taken on notice

1.	In relation to the Brooking Road extension project and the adjacent Falls Road bridge upgrade, which will affect many residents and ratepayers in that area, how then should we, as the residents and ratepayers expect to hear about public works and what engagement is planning going forward to give all affected community members the opportunity to input into how these works proceed?	The Director Built & Natural Environment advised that this project has been on the Shire's radar for a number of years and the Shire has spoken to a number of people in the area from time to time. As that has progressed, the notification that was sent out a few weeks ago targeted those properties in that area. It is noted that Mr Petridis's property was just outside the area that was originally communicated with. The Shire is more than happy to continue ongoing dialogue with any interested parties.
2.	What is the governance process and communication plan that's adhered to?	The Director Place & Community advised that the Shire does have a Community Engagement Framework which dictates the sort of engagement that might be done in terms of minimum requirements and that is across the spectrum depending on the issue and as to who may be consulted or informed or let know about key decisions.

Colin Hughes – Greenmount

1. What was the policy and progress for installing EV's at Boya Library, noting that the new library in Mundaring is going to have EV charging?

The Director Built & Natural Environment advised that there are currently no plans to instal an EV charging station at Boya Library.

The Shire President advised that the Mundaring Library is only at the design phase so there is currently no plan at this point for an EV charging station.

2. What process do we need to go through to put EV on Boya Library for the residents who live in that area?

The Chief Executive Officer advised that there are a number of ways that the matter of EV charging stations can get onto the Council agenda. An elected member can move a notice of motion to request Council give it consideration. The Shire will be undertaking some more localised place planning in each of our main three areas (hills, foothills, rural), so there is another opportunity through that process for it to be identified for EV charging as a potential opportunity moving forward, and then every year, Council reviews its annual Council Plan which details a whole range of projects and a project like EV charging could get on to a Council agenda in that way. The Shire President advised that each vear the Shire has an electors meeting where electors of the Shire can attend and put a motion for Council's consideration. That meeting is generally around February/March and is advertised every year.

Eric Smith - Glen Forrest

3. Is it going to be Council policy that on many, several community projects that the community will be consulted for valuable input, or are we just going to get the same rhetoric of lack of consultation?

The Chief Executive Officer advised that the consultation on projects will depend on a range of factors. These factors would generally include elements such as scale and/or perceived community impact. There's a whole range of issues that staff will look at with Council to determine the level of consultation. including if any consultation is required at all. There's also the opportunity, again through the Engagement Framework, where it might be a case where the Shire informs the community of what is planned as opposed to going out and actually engaging and seeking feedback. So it is very dependent on a project by project basis.

8.0 PRESENTATIONS

8.1 Deputations

1.	Simon O'Hara	Item 10.4 – Amendment No. 20 to Local Planning Scheme No. 4 – Rezone lot 99 Betty Street, Chidlow	Spoke on behalf of the applicant and supports the officers' recommendation for the scheme amendment, which continues a process initiated by Council in December 2016 to enable subdivision and development. The amendment recodes the site from R2.5 to R5 with no objections received. He urged Council to approve the amendment
2.	Eric Smith	Item 11.1 – Notice of Motion: Speed Limit Change – Great Eastern Highway, Greenmount	Spoke against the motion and expressed concerns about speed limits on Great Eastern Highway, noting that many motorists do not adhere to the current limit and frequently disregard stop signs, particularly at Scott Street. Believes that reducing the speed limit further could worsen traffic issues, increase pollution, and push more vehicles onto suburban roads, emphasising that driver behaviour and road conditions are the primary problems rather than speed limits alone.
3.	Colin Hughes	Item 11.1 - Notice of Motion: Speed Limit Change – Great Eastern Highway, Greenmount	Spoke in favour of the motion and highlighted a report from Main Roads that analysed accident-prone sections of Great Eastern Highway, particularly between Scott Street and Bilgoman Road. Based on scientific findings, Main Roads recommends reducing the speed limit to 70 km/h up to Lionel Road and further to 60 km/h down Old York Road, citing evidence that lower speed limits significantly reduce serious accidents. He urged councillors to review the report, endorse its recommendations, and push for immediate implementation to improve road safety.

4. Nomination and Declaration forms – Cr Luke Ellery

PURPOSE

To elect a new Deputy President, following the resignation of current deputy Cr Cook as a Councillor as a result of her election as a member of the House of Representatives for the seat of Bullwinkel.

BACKGROUND

Cr Cook served as a councillor for the Shire of Mundaring for six years and was elected as deputy shire president in 2023. Ms Cook provided a written formal resignation on 27 May 2025 to the Chief Executive Officer, which creates a vacancy in her position as Councillor and deputy president. Council is therefore required to elect a new deputy president for the rest of the Council term until the 2025 Local Government Election.

The *Local Government Act 1995* (the Act) includes provisions for the election of a councillor to hold the office of deputy president. Division 2 of Schedule 2.3 of the Act provides when and how a councillor is elected to hold the office of deputy president.

STATUTORY / LEGAL IMPLICATIONS

Procedure to Elect Deputy President

Division 2 of Schedule 2.3 of the Act provides when and how a councillor is elected to hold the office of deputy president.

The *Local Government Act 1995* (the Act) includes provisions for the election of a councillor to hold the office of deputy president.

Refer to **Attachment 1** for a copy of the nomination form to be used when nominating for the office of deputy president. Refer to **Attachment 2** for a copy of the nomination form to be used when nominating another councillor for the office of deputy president.

Note: after nominations for the office of deputy president have been closed, prior to the ballot, each candidate will be provided an opportunity to address Council for a maximum of three minutes.

The procedure to elect the deputy president is as follows:

8. How deputy mayor or deputy president is elected

(1) The council is to elect a councillor (other than the mayor or president) to fill the office.

- (2) The election is to be conducted in accordance with the procedure prescribed by the mayor or president, or if he or she is not present, by the CEO.
- (3) Nominations for the office are to be given to the person conducting the election in writing before the meeting or during the meeting before the close of nominations.
- (3a) Nominations close at the meeting at a time announced by the person conducting the election, which is to be a sufficient time after the announcement by that person that nominations are about to close to allow for any nominations made to be dealt with.
- (4) If a councillor is nominated by another councillor the person conducting the election is not to accept the nomination unless the nominee has advised the person conducting the election, orally or in writing, that he or she is willing to be nominated for the office.
- (5) The council members are to vote on the matter by secret ballot as if they were electors voting at an election.
- (6) Subject to clause 9(1) the votes cast under subclause (5) are to be counted, and the successful candidate determined, in accordance with Schedule 4.1 as if those votes were votes cast at an election.
- (7) As soon as is practicable after the result of the election is known, the person conducting the election is to declare and give notice of the result in accordance with regulations, if any.

9. Votes may be cast a second time

- (1) If, when the votes cast under clause 8(5) are counted, there is an equality of votes between 2 or more candidates who are the only candidates in, or remaining in, the count, the count is to be discontinued and, not more than 7 days later, a special meeting of the council is to be held.
- (2) Any nomination for the office may be withdrawn, and further nominations may be made, before or when the special meeting is held.
- (3) When the special meeting is held the council members are to vote again on the matter by secret ballot as if they were voting at an election.
- (4) The votes cast under subclause (3) are to be counted, and the successful candidate determined, under Schedule 4.1 as if those votes were votes cast at an election.

Division 2 of Schedule 4.1 of the Act provides how votes are to be counted and how to ascertain results in a one office election.

2. One office election: 2 candidates

- (1) If there are only 2 candidates in a one office election
 - (a) the first-preference votes for each candidate must be counted; and
 - (b) the candidate who has the greater number of first-preference votes is elected.
- (2) If the candidates have the same number of first-preference votes, the returning officer must draw lots in accordance with regulations to determine which candidate is elected.

3. One office election: 3 or more candidates

Clauses 4 and 5 apply if there are 3 or more candidates in a one office election.

4. Count of first-preference votes

- (1) The first-preference votes for each candidate must be counted.
- (2) A candidate is elected if the number of first-preference votes for the candidate exceeds 50% of the total number of all the first-preference votes for candidates.

5. Process if no candidate elected under clause 4

- (1) The process in subclause (2)
 - (a) must be followed if no candidate is elected under clause 4; and
 - (b) as necessary, must be repeated until a candidate is elected under subclause (3). Notes for this subclause:
 - 1. Subclauses (4) to (6) supplement subclauses (2) and (3) for cases where candidates have the same number of votes.
 - 2. Subclauses (7) and (8) explain how the terms ballot paper and continuing candidate are used in this clause.
- (2) The process is as follows
 - (a) exclude the candidate (the excluded candidate) with
 - (i) if this process is being followed for the first time the fewest first-preference votes; or
 - (ii) if this process is being repeated the fewest votes on the last count under paragraph (d);
 - (b) set aside as exhausted any ballot paper of the excluded candidate that contains
 - (i) no preference votes at all; or
 - (ii) no preference votes for any continuing candidates;
 - (c) transfer any remaining ballot papers of the excluded candidate that indicate the next available preference for a particular continuing candidate to that continuing candidate;
 - (d) count the number of votes for each of the continuing candidates by totalling the following
 - (i) the number of first-preference votes for the continuing candidate;
 - (ii) if this process is being followed for the first time the total number of ballot papers transferred to the continuing candidate under paragraph (c);
 - (iii) if this process is being repeated the total number of ballot papers transferred to the continuing candidate under paragraph (c) on this or a previous occasion.
- (3) A continuing candidate is elected if, on a count under subclause (2)(d), the number of votes for the continuing candidate exceeds 50% of the total number of all the votes for continuing candidates.
- (4) Subclause (6) applies if subclause (2)(a) cannot otherwise be applied because, as the case requires
 - (a) 2 or more candidates have the same number of first-preference votes (no other candidates having fewer first-preference votes); or
 - (b) 2 or more candidates have the same number of votes on the last count under subclause (2)(d) (no other candidates having fewer votes).
- (5) Subclause (6) also applies if subclause (3) cannot otherwise be applied because
 - (a) there are only 2 continuing candidates in a count under subclause (2)(d); and
 - (b) on the count, the continuing candidates have the same number of votes.

- (6) The returning officer must draw lots in accordance with regulations to determine, as the case requires
 - (a) the candidate to be excluded; or
 - (b) the continuing candidate to be elected.
- (7) For the purposes of the process in subclause (2), a ballot paper is a ballot paper of the excluded candidate if either of the following applies
 - (a) the ballot paper contains a first-preference vote for the excluded candidate;
 - (b) the process is being repeated and the ballot paper was transferred to the excluded candidate under subclause (2)(c) on a previous occasion.
- (8) For the purposes of the process in subclause (2), a continuing candidate is a candidate to whom neither of the following applies
 - (a) the candidate is the excluded candidate;
 - (b) the process is being repeated and the candidate was excluded under subclause(2)(a) on a previous occasion.

The regulations referred to in Schedule 4.1 clause 2(2) are the *Local Government (Elections) Regulations 1997*.

Declaration by the Deputy President

Section 2.29 requires that a person elected by the council as deputy president has to make a declaration in the prescribed form before acting in the office (refer **Attachment 3**).

Regulation 13 of the *Local Government (Constitution) Regulations 1995* provides the prescribed form, Form 7, and the following (in part):

- (3) A declaration required by section 2.29 to be made by a person elected as a councillor, deputy mayor or deputy president is to be made before an authorised person. ...
- (5) In this regulation —

authorised person means a person before whom a statutory declaration can be made under the Oaths. Affidavits and Statutory Declarations Act 2005.

<u>Note</u>: the Chief Executive Officer is an authorised person under the *Oaths, Affidavits and Statutory Declarations Act 2005*.

As no further nominations were received the Chief Executive Officer declared Cr Ellery as Deputy President of the Shire of Mundaring.

Declaration by the Deputy President

Section 2.29 requires that a person elected by the council as deputy president has to make a declaration in the prescribed form before acting in the office (refer **Attachment 3**).

Regulation 13 of the *Local Government (Constitution) Regulations 1995* provides the prescribed form, Form 7, and the following (in part):

- (3) A declaration required by section 2.29 to be made by a person elected as a councillor, deputy mayor or deputy president is to be made before an authorised person. ...
- (5) In this regulation —

authorised person means a person before whom a statutory declaration can be made under the Oaths, Affidavits and Statutory Declarations Act 2005.

<u>Note</u>: the Chief Executive Officer is an authorised person under the *Oaths, Affidavits and Statutory Declarations Act 2005*.

Cr Ellery made a declaration of office of Deputy President (using the prescribed form), under the *Oaths, Affidavits and Statutory Declarations Act 2005*, before the Chief Executive Officer.

PURPOSE

To acknowledge the formal resignation of Cr Trish, Cook as a Councillor and to seek Council's approval to request for the Councillor vacancy to remain unfilled until the October 2025 Local Government Ordinary Election.

BACKGROUND

Cr Cook won the seat of Bullwinkel, in 2025 federal election, and subsequently has resigned as a Councillor. Ms Cook provided a written formal resignation to the Chief Executive Officer on 27 May 2025 effective immediately. In accordance with *Local Government Act 1995*, Council can choose to either hold an extraordinary election to fill the vacancy or request from the Electoral Commissioner to allow the vacancy to remain unfilled.

If a councillor resigns before their term ends, an extraordinary election may be held to fill the vacancy. The process generally involves:

- 1. Submitting a formal resignation—the councillor must provide written notice to the CEO of the local government.
- 2. Council acknowledgment—the resignation is recorded, and the council determines whether an election is required.
- 3. Extraordinary election—if needed, an election is conducted to fill the vacancy for the remainder of the term.
- 4. Returning officer appointment—the CEO or another approved person oversees the election.

If Council chooses not to fill the vacancy, a Council resolution is required to submit a request to the Electoral Commissioner to this effect. In this case Council has 30 days to submit the request from the date of the Councillor's resignation.

STATUTORY / LEGAL IMPLICATIONS

2.31 (2) Resignation

A councillor may —

- (a) resign from the office of councillor;
- (b) resign from the office of councillor mayor or president, deputy mayor or deputy president.
- (3) Written notice of resignation is to be signed and dated by the person who is resigning and delivered to the CEO.

(4) The resignation takes effect from the date of delivery of the notice or from a later day specified in the notice.

4.17. Cases in which vacant offices can remain unfilled

- (2) If a member's office becomes vacant under section 2.32 —
- (a) after the third Saturday in October in the year before the election year in which the term of the office would have

ended under the Table to section 2.28; but

(b) before the third Saturday in July in that election year, the council may, with the approval of the Electoral Commissioner, allow the vacancy to remain unfilled and, in that case, the term of the member who held the office is to be regarded in section 4.6 as ending on the day on which it would have ended if the vacancy had not occurred.

4.9. Election day for extraordinary election

- (1) Any poll needed for an extraordinary election is to be held on a day decided on and fixed —
- (a) by the mayor or president, in writing, if a day has not already been fixed under paragraph (b); or
- (b) by the council at a meeting held within one month after the vacancy occurs, if a day has not already been fixed under paragraph (a).

FINANCIAL IMPLICATIONS

In accordance with the Local Government (Elections) Regulations 1997, the Commission has conducted elections on behalf of the Shire of Mundaring's based on full accrual cost recovery. The cost of running an extraordinary election will be charged to Shire of Mundaring.

A formal quote from the Commission to conduct an extraordinary election has been requested but not received at the time of preparing this report. Based on the total cost of the 2023 full election \$152,000) for three wards and the role of president and noting increased election costs flagged by the Commission for 2025, the cost of an election for the south Ward only is tentatively estimated to be in the vicinity of \$25,000 to \$40,000.

PURPOSE

To appoint Councillor representatives to Committees, Advisory Groups and External Organisations and Groups for the rest of 2023-2025 term, that have membership vacancies because of Cr Cook's resignation from Council and further appoint new presiding person to the CEO Performance Review Committee.

BACKGROUND

Cr Cook won the seat of Bullwinkel, in 2025 federal election, and subsequently resigned as a Councillor. This effectively dissolved her membership from all Council appointed Committees, Advisory Groups and external Organisations and Groups. Council is therefore required to appoint Councillor representatives for the rest of the 23-25 term, to fill the following vacancies.

Committees

- Audit and Risk Committee
- Chief Executive Officer Performance Committee
- Local Emergency Management Committee

External Organisations and Groups

- Western Australian Local Government Association East Metropolitan Zone
- Western Australian Local Government Association Annual General Meeting (voting delegates)

STATUTORY / LEGAL IMPLICATIONS

Generally, committees are established under section 5.8 of the *Local Government Act* 1995 (the Act) and may be comprised of council members and other persons (referred to as 'external members' in the adopted Terms of Reference) consistent with section 5.9 of the Act.

Committee Presiding Member Appointments

Part 5, Subdivision 2 provides for committees including establishment and appointment of members. Part 5 Subdivision 3 of the Act provides for the quorum, voting, decisions and minutes of committees. The *Local Government (Administration) Regulations 1996* also make provisions in regard to committees.

The Local Government Act has been reformed to mandate that local councils appoint committee chairs (Presiding Members) by absolute majority, by no later than July 1, 2025, in accordance with section 5.8 of the *Local Government Act 1995* (LG Act. This change eliminates the previous practice of committees electing their chairs.

Audit and Risk Committee

Section 7.1A of the Act provides the following in relation to audit committees (in part):

- (1) A local government is to establish an audit committee of 3 or more persons to exercise the powers and discharge the duties conferred on it.
- (2) The members of the audit committee of a local government are to be appointed* by the local government and at least 3 of the members, and the majority of the members, are to be council members.
 - * Absolute majority required...

The Local Government Amendment (Auditing) Act 2017 gives the Auditor General the mandate to take on responsibility for the annual financial audits of all Western Australian local governments.

The Local Government (Audit) Regulations 1996 provide details on the functions of an audit committee.

Chief Executive Officer Performance Review Committee

Part 5, Division 4 of the Act provides statutory obligations in regards to local government employees including:

- that all employees whose employment is for a term of one year or more, including the Chief Executive Officer (CEO), have their performance reviewed on an annual basis (section 5.38); and
- the standards for reviewing CEOs performance (section 5.39A and 5.39B)

Schedule 2 of the *Local Government (Administration) Regulations 1996* prescribes the standards for the recruitment, selection, performance and termination of the local government CEO.

The CEOPRC has been established to meet the Shire's statutory obligations.

Local Emergency Management Committee

The LEMC is established under the provisions of the *Emergency Management Act 2005*. Section 38 provides for local emergency management committees as follows:

- (1) A local government is to establish one or more local emergency management committees for the local government's district.
- (2) If more than one local emergency management committee is established, the local government is to specify the area in respect of which the committee is to exercise its functions.
- (3) A local emergency management committee consists of
 - (a) a chairman and other members appointed by the relevant local government in accordance with subsection (4); and
 - (b) if the local emergency coordinator is not appointed as chairman of the committee, the local emergency coordinator for the local government district.

(4) Subject to this section, the constitution and procedures of a local emergency management committee, and the terms and conditions of appointment of members, are to be determined by the SEMC.

Although not established under section 5.8 of the Act, LEMC operates in keeping with the principles of the Act.

Section 5.11 of the *Local Government Act 1995* states that where a person is appointed as a member of a committee, their membership continues until the next ordinary election day, unless they have previously resigned, the committee is disbanded or they no longer hold the office by virtue of which they became a member.

Although appointments to external organisations and groups do not have the same formal status as a Committee of Council, the principle of appointments for the same two year period (in keeping with the election cycle) is still applied.

Western Australian Local Government Association (WALGA) East Metropolitan Zone

WALGA is an independent, member based, not for profit organisation representing and supporting the WA Local Government sector.

Zones are groups of geographically aligned Member Councils. Zones provide input into State Council's advocacy agenda. The East Metropolitan Zone comprises the following local governments:

- City of Bayswater
- City of Belmont
- City of Kalamunda
- City of Swan
- Shire of Mundaring
- Town of Bassendean

State Councillors are elected to State Council from the Zones.

WALGA Annual General Meeting

Each year, WALGA holds an AGM of members alongside the annual WA Local Government Convention.

Only registered delegates and/or proxies will be permitted to exercise voting entitlements on behalf of Shire of Mundaring.

PURPOSE

For Council to consider whether to support proposed Amendment No 20 to Local Planning Scheme No.4 (LPS4). Refer to **Attachment 1**.

BACKGROUND

Site Description

The subject sites are currently vacant and are both zoned Residential R2.5 under LPS4. They fall within Structure Plan 69 (SP69), and are bound by unsealed sections of Thornwick Crescent to the north, Port Place to the south, and Betty Street to the east (refer to the locality plan below).

Locality Plan



SP69 shows Lot 99 Betty Street being public open space (POS), and Lot 9100 Thornwick Crescent (shown as Lot 382 on SP69) being Residential R2.5 (refer to **Attachment 2**). The remainder of all other Residential sites within SP69 are shown to be Residential R5.

With the exception of Lot 382, all of the properties were rezoned from Residential R2.5 to Residential R5 upon the Gazettal of LPS4 in February 2014.

Previous Relevant Decisions

In March 2016, Council resolved to surrender (revoke) management of Reserve 46307 (now known as Lot 99 Betty Street and Lot 9100 Thornwick Crescent), and recommend that Structure Plan 69 (SP69) be approved (**C5.03.16**). The following being from the OCM report at the time (with emphasis added):

"The executive of the Department of Lands has agreed to sell Lot 382 (Reserve 46307) to Uzbek Pty Ltd who are the main landholder within the Structure Plan 69 area. Lot 382 is a 1.7 hectare site located in the north easternmost lot.

"For the sale to progress, DoL has invited the Shire to surrender its management."

"Should Council decide not to surrender management control, the Minister may revoke the management order without Council's consent and proceed with the sale."

"It is the intention of Uzbek Pty Ltd, subsequent to acquiring the site, to rezone Lot 382 to Residential R5 and amalgamate it with 805 (Lot 298) Thornwick Crescent – creating a single, contiguous property with additional subdivision potential. If the sale proceeds, the owner would have the option to lodge a rezoning proposal which would be subject to a future Council determination.

While there is good quality bushland on the site, protection is limited given it is already committed for residential development under LPS4.

Given DoL's decision to sell the land, and the status of the vegetation as 'committed' for residential subdivision, it is logical that Council agree to surrender the management of Reserve 46307 and advise the DoL accordingly."

Lot 382 on SP69 was left with an R2.5 coding as it was Crown land at the time. Whereas the remainder of the residential sites within SP69 were given an R5 coding. The eastern portion of Lot 382 (Lot 99 Betty Street) is shown on SP69 to be POS due to being adjacent to a scarred tree that has Aboriginal heritage significance.

According to the Officer's report presented to Council in March 2016, SP69 will result in approximately 67 lots.


In March 2017, the WAPC endorsed SP69 (refer to **Attachment 2**) which includes the subject sites. Subsequently, the majority of the area has been subdivided in accordance with SP69.

In December 2024, Council resolved (**C10.12.24**) to adopt (initiate) Amendment No.20, and forward to the WAPC for the Minister's consent to advertise and to the Environmental Protection Authority for comment.

Details of the Proposal

It is proposed to amend LPS4 by recoding portion of Lot 9100 from R2.5 to R5. Also, by rezoning Lot 99 from Residential to Local Planning Scheme Reserve 'Recreation' as shown in the images which follow.

STATUTORY / LEGAL IMPLICATIONS

Planning and Development (Local Planning Schemes) Regulations 2015

Amendments to Local Planning Schemes

At its December 2024 Ordinary meeting, Council resolved that Amendment No.20 is a Standard Amendment, which under the LPS Regulations is identified to be the following:

• Standard Amendment (Part 5, Division 3 of the LPS Regulations) – These are Scheme Amendments of less strategic significance or complexity that are neither a basic or complex amendment.

The following being the reasons why it was considered to be a Standard Amendment:

- a) the amendment is to modify a planning code;
- b) the amendment would not have a significant impact on land in the Scheme area that is not the subject of the amendment;
- c) the amendment does not result in any significant environmental, social, economic or governance impacts on land in the scheme area;
- d) the amendment is not considered a complex or basic amendment.

Advertisement of Amendment if Approved by Minister

In accordance with Regulation 64(1) of the LPS Regulations, if the Minister approves Amendment No.20 the WAPC must publish notice of the decision in the Government Gazette. The new LPS4 provisions will take affect once the Government Gazette notice is published.

The Shire would then be required to undertake the following actions in accordance with Regulation 64(2) of the LPS Regulations and section 87(4B)(a) of the *Planning and Development Act 2005*:

- Publish a copy of the Government Gazette notice regarding the Minister's decision (e.g. in a local newspaper and on the Engage Mundaring website).
- Publish a copy of the approved Amendment No.21 document (e.g. make available on the Engage Mundaring website).
- Notify each person who made a submission in relation to Amendment No.21 of the Minister's approval decision, and advise where the Amendment No.21 document has been published.

POLICY IMPLICATIONS

Community Engagement Policy

Having had regard to the "Community Engagement Policy" (CD-04), the consultation approach (refer to the External Consultation section of this report) ensured that those potentially affected, and the community generally, were informed and consulted.

FINANCIAL IMPLICATIONS

In accordance with the LPS Regulations, Shire costs associated with the assessment, advertising and gazettal of the scheme amendment may be met by the landowner.

Outcome 6.1 - Promote responsible planning to meet current and future needs.

Local Planning Strategy

The Local Planning Strategy identifies the area as an opportunity to increase the residential density from R2.5 to R5, which will "help ensure that the existing Residential zoned land in Chidlow is sufficient to cater for the village's growth throughout the life of this Strategy, without the need to expand into adjacent land".

SUSTAINABILITY IMPLICATIONS

Should the proposal be ultimately approved by the Minister the subdivision and dwelling construction phase which follows will generate a period of economic activity.

In regard to social benefit, rezoning Lot 99 Betty Street from Residential to Local Planning Scheme Reserve 'Recreation' will ensure that the scarred tree is better protected from any future residential development.

RISK IMPLICATIONS

EXTERNAL CONSULTATION

In accordance with Section 81 of the *Planning and Development Act 2005*, the Amendment was referred to the Environmental Protection Authority (EPA). The EPA considered that the proposal should not be assessed under the *Environmental Protection Act 1986*.

In accordance with Regulation 46 of the LPS Regulations, the Shire sought and obtained the Minister's approval to advertise the proposed amendment. It was then advertised in accordance with Regulation 47 of the LPS Regulations.

Advertising was undertaken between 21 March and 2 May 2025 (being 42 days) and included:

- A notice in the local newspaper and online via the Shire's social media account;
- A notice and copy of the Amendment No.20 report (Attachment 1) on the Shire's Engage Mundaring website, and at the Shire's Administration Centre and libraries;
- Letters being sent to nearby affected landowners and the Chidlow Progress Association;
- Notification being sent to the Department of Fire and Emergency Services, South West Aboriginal Land and Sea Council, Whadjuk Aboriginal Corporation, Water Corporation, Department of Water and Environmental Regulation, Department of Biodiversity, Conservation and Attractions, and Department of Health; and
- Signs being placed adjacent to the subject sites inviting comment on the proposal.

During the advertising period 5 submissions were received. Refer to the Schedule of Submissions (**Attachment 3**) for an outline of the comments received and the Shire Officer's responses.

With regard to the comments in the schedule of submissions which have been 'noted', Shire Officers have had regard to them (as well as the other comments) as part of the assessment process in accordance with the LPS Regulations.

In accordance with Regulation 50 of the LPS Regulations, the Shire has a 60-day consideration period by which to consider all submissions and for Council to pass a resolution:

- a) to support the amendment without modification; or
- b) to support the amendment with proposed modifications to address issues raised in the submissions; or
- c) not to support the amendment.

Once Council has made its resolution on the proposed Scheme Amendment, the Scheme Amendment report and the schedule of submissions will be referred to the WAPC which will deliver a recommendation to the Minister for Planning. The Minister will then make the final decision on the Scheme Amendment.

COMMENT

Future Development

In accordance with the Residential Design Codes, the proposed R5 coding for Lot 9100 would potentially allow for the site to accommodate between 1 and 3 additional dwellings compared to what its current R2.5 coding allows. Shire Officers do not consider this to be a significant increase.

Matters relating to infrastructure, traffic, heritage, bushfire management and the natural environment were all considered as part of SP69 (which included Lots 99 and 9100). Amendment No.20 would not result in any significant changes, if any, regarding how they will be addressed/managed.

The remainder of the residential lots within SP69 are to remain unchanged in terms of their zoning, configuration and coding (being Residential R5).

Natural Environment

Removal of some trees and understorey vegetation on Lot 9100 is expected as a result of future subdivision works and compliance with fire requirements (the Firebreak and Fuel Load Notice and WAPC Guidelines for Planning in Bushfire Prone Areas). The vegetation in question is within the Local Natural Area category 'Limited Protection/Already Committed by Zoning'.

Lot 99 Betty Street is shown on SP69 to be POS due to being adjacent to a scarred tree that has Aboriginal heritage significance. Currently it is zoned Residential under LPS4. Rezoning this site to Local Planning Scheme Reserve 'Recreation' will ensure that its intended purpose is consistent with SP69 and the scarred tree is better protected from any future residential development.

Bushfire Management

The subject site is located in an area mapped as being bushfire prone. The existing SP69 assessed bushfire issues against State Planning Policy 3.7 - Planning in Bushfire Prone Areas, as have subsequent development and subdivision applications within the SP69 area. They have demonstrated that the proposed R5 coding, and subsequent residential development upon them, is capable of being compliant with this policy.

As outlined above, the proposal will not result in a significant increase in additional lots. It simply proposes to change the coding of an existing Residential site and rezone a Residential site to 'Recreation'. Any further applications for subdivision or development on the Residential sites within the locality will be assessed against the bushfire legislation at the time of them being lodged and be required to provide the necessary documentation (e.g. BAL contour maps, new bushfire management plan etc.).

Shire Officers have no concerns regarding the future public open space and road reserves not being able to be maintained to a low threat status.

Construction of the public roads is a requirement of a previously approved subdivision for the subject area.

During the advertising period no concerns were received from the South West Aboriginal Land and Sea Council, Whadjuk Aboriginal Corporation, Department of Water and Environmental Regulation, and/or the Department of Biodiversity, Conservation and Attractions.

Considering the above, it is recommended that Council supports Amendment No.20.

REPORT

1.0 INTRODUCTION

The intention of this proposal is to rationalize the R coding of the street block bounded by Thornwick Cres, Betty St, Northcote St and Old Northam Rd, Chidlow to:

- a) Modify the only portion of the privately owned land within the street block coded R2.5 so that it is made consistent with the balance of the land, which is coded R5; and
- b) Remove the Crown land (Lot 99) from its current 'Residential' zoning and set it aside as a Local Planning Scheme Reserve for Recreation.

2.0 BACKGROUND

The subject site is contained within a Structure Plan recommended for approval by the Council in 2016 and subsequently approved by the WA Planning Commission in 2017. At the time of the assessment by Council the subject site was known as Lot 382.

Also at the time of assessment by Council it is noted in the Council minutes that Lot 382 was in the process of being sold to the current landowners. It was anticipated that an application to

amend the Scheme to apply a R5 code to Lot 382 would be received. That request has been withheld pending the creation of the POS reserve (Lot 99) so that the precise boundaries of the reserve land were known thereby making the Recreation reservation (POS) under LPS 4 accurate.

Stage 1 of the subdivision provided for under that Structure Plan has been completed. Stage 1 included the creation of the POS included in this Scheme Amendment.

Location

The subject site is located on the NE corner of the street block bounded by Thornwick Cres, Betty St, Northcote St and Old Northam Rd, Chidlow. This street block is located in the north-eastern corner of the Chidlow residential townsite.

Site Area

The subject site is approximately 1.7ha in area. The recently created new reserve (Lot 99) is 0.3131ha of this total area. This is the area proposed to be set aside as a local reserve through this Amendment. The balance 1.3869ha, which forms part of the recently created balance Lot 9100, is the area proposed to be coded R5.

Ownership

Lot 9100 is owned by Uzbek Pty Ltd. Lot 99 is a Crown reserve.

Current & Surrounding Land Uses

Lot 9100 is vacant. It is undergoing subdivision in accordance with the approved Structure Plan. This vacant land is to the west and south of the site proposed to be recoded and reserved. Stage 1 has been created and works have taken place across the entire site to enable the creation of further stages. Lot 99 was created and transferred to the Crown in the first stage and will remain vacant.

The land to the north and east of this site is bushland reserve.

Physical Characteristics

The property is mainly cleared land with pockets of trees. It rises from approximately 293m AHD at its Thornwick Cres frontage in the north to approximately 304m AHD at its southern boundary at a gentle gradient of around 5%. It contains no watercourses, rock outcrops or other natural features.

Heritage

The site was part of a broader WWII Defence Forces campsite. It has been scoured for military artifacts by the Friends of Chidlow WW2 Camp and these now reside with the Mundaring & Hills Historical Society or with descendants of individuals who stayed at the camp. The proposed Amendment will have no impact on the nearby remnants of the former camp because it proposes no extension of the development area.

The site also contains a site of Aboriginal Heritage significance. This site is contained within the unconstructed road reserve adjacent to Lot 99. The creation of Lot 99 as a reserve provides significant protection of this heritage feature.

<u>Infrastructure</u>

The subject site is serviced by reticulated water and power. Reticulated sewer is not available so on-site disposal of wastewater will be required. The capability of the site for on-site effluent

disposal has been demonstrated through a Site & Soil Evaluation carried out in 2023 as part of the subdivision approval process for this site.

The site has existing frontage to both Thornwick Cres & Betty St, however, the approved Structure Plan provides for an internal subdivision road to service the new lots as Thornwick Cres and Betty St will be used for bushfire access only.

3.0 LOCAL PLANNING CONTEXT

Local Planning Strategy

The Shire of Mundaring Local Planning Strategy seeks to maintain the current extent of Residential zoning in Chidlow but increase densities from R2.5 to R5 within those extents where land is primarily cleared. The land bounded by Thornwick Cres, Betty St, Northcote St and Old Northam Rd is one of those areas and was re-coded to R5 with the adoption of LPS 4. Lot 382, as it was known then, was left unchanged because it was Crown land at the time.

SPP 3.0 Urban Growth and Settlement

SPP 3.0 includes as one of its objectives the intention to build on existing communities with established local and regional economies. This is consistent with the proposed Amendment.

SPP 3.7 Planning in Bushfire Prone Areas

The subject site is located in an area mapped as being bushfire prone. The existing approved Structure Plan assessed bushfire issues against SPP 3.7, as have subsequent subdivision applications. They have demonstrated that the proposed R5 coding will be compliant with this policy.

Local Planning Scheme No 4

This currently codes all lots within the street block as being coded R5 except for the site the subject of this proposed amendment (refer zoning maps).

4.0 PROPOSAL

The proposal is to recode the subject site from R2.5 to R5 under the Residential Design Codes. This was foreshadowed in Council minutes (8/3/16) when the Government agreed to sell the property to the current owners. At the same time, Lot 99, which has been transferred to the Crown as a reserve and provides separation to a site of Aboriginal heritage significance, is proposed to have the Residential zoning removed and be reserved under LPS 4 providing further protection. Matters for consideration that are specific to this site are discussed below.

Ground and Site Conditions

Soils on the site are lateritic gravel, which is typical of the land east of the Darling escarpment and matches the soil on the rest of the land contained within Lot 9100.

The topography of the site is gentle with an incline of 5% rising from north to south.

Vegetation is sparse as clearing has occurred to enable progression of subdivision in accordance with approvals granted. Strategic trees have been retained in consultation with Shire of Mundaring staff.

Wetlands and Waterways

There are no waterways or wetlands on the site. The closest watercourse is approximately 250m to the north-east.

Groundwater

Test holes dug as part of a Site & Soil Evaluation that accompanied the subdivision application found no groundwater. This included two holes dug in the location proposed to be recoded to R5.

Contaminated Sites

Due to its historical use, asbestos was found in the area of the subject site. This was brought to the attention of the Department of Water & Environmental Regulation and an assessment of the extent of the contamination was conducted followed by a complete remediation programme. On the 1/6/23 DWER issued written advice that the site is classified as decontaminated.

Services

Reticulated water and power are available to the site and have been extended progressively as subdivision proceeds. There is no reticulated sewer available in the township of Chidlow. Wastewater is disposed of by on-site means. The SSE that accompanied the subdivision application demonstrated that a primary treatment system can be used.

Bushfire Management

The site is mapped as being bushfire prone and in accordance with the requirements of SPP3.7 a Bushfire Management Plan (BMP) has been prepared and submitted with each subdivision application. This includes strategic firebreaks around the northern & eastern perimeter of Lot 9100 within the alignments of Thornwick Crescent and Betty St in the form of a Fire Service Access Route. These have been constructed as part of Stage 1 of the subdivision. This enables lots on the area proposed to be recoded to R5 to achieve a BAL-29 or better.

Subdivision

Should the Amendment be completed, subsequent subdivision will be required to comply with the design standards at the time. These would likely still include such matters as bushfire safety, avoiding battle-axe lots, drainage, etc.

5.0 CONCLUSION

The proposed amendment is consistent with Councils Local Planning Strategy and was foreshadowed when the property was sold by the State Government. It will remove an inconsistency in coding and protect the newly created Public Open Space by placing a reservation over it under the Scheme.





The development application and the BMP have adequately identified issues arising from the bushfire risk assessment and considered how compliance with the bushfire protection criteria can be achieved for the scheme amendment proposal. However, modifications to the BMP are considered necessary to ensure it accurately identifies the bushfire risk and necessary mitigation measures. In line with the requirements of the Guidelines, it is recommended that such modifications be provided in a new BMP, or as an addendum to the submitted BMP. As these modifications will not affect the development design, these modifications can be undertaken without further referral to DFES.

PURPOSE

For Council to consider continuing its partnership with the Mundaring Adult Creative and Learning Inc. by extending the agreement by an additional 4 years, which will assist Council deliver adult learning programs within the Shire of Mundaring.

BACKGROUND

The Shire currently has a four year service agreement in place with Mundaring Adult Creative and Learning Inc with this agreement set to expire 30 June 2025. Service agreements are formal funding arrangements between the Shire and community organisations who provide an ongoing service to the community and maintain a continual community presence. Council has traditionally viewed such community organisations as being best placed to deliver services from which the community would benefit.

Mundaring Adult Learning and Creative Inc. (previously Mundaring Sharing Inc.) has been operating for over 45 years. The organisation possesses a proven record of successfully providing adult education programmes and activities to the community. This includes, where possible, integrating with the Shire's strategic planning. Mundaring Adult Creative and Learning Inc operates and oversees a diverse range of activities and workshops. These activities offer opportunities for community members to either deliver or attend adult community education classes that showcase a diverse range of interests and talents to the broader community.

Mundaring Adult Creative and Learning Inc. has a proven record in adult education over many years, enabling the delivery of programs through an Administration Executive role and volunteer support. The organisation has recently gone from strength to strength with classes at capacity, driven by volunteers. The organisation enriches the community's social aspects.

In receiving the funding, Mundaring Adult Learning and Creative Inc is required to achieve the following objectives :

- To promote and deliver adult community education activities in the Shire of Mundaring.
- To increase the financial sustainability of Mundaring Adult Learning and Creative Centre Inc..
- To recognise and support business growth opportunities.
- To conduct volunteer recruitment, training and succession planning program.

These objectives are supported by 13 strategies and initiatives, demonstrated through key performance indicators (KPIs) (**Attachment 1**). These service measures are reviewed annually by the Manager Community, Culture & Visitor Experience and the Chairperson of Mundaring Adult Learning and Creative Centre Inc. . The Mundaring Adult Creative & Learning Centre (Centre) have assessed the economic benefit of their program as approximately \$45,000 per year. is the methodology utilised to estimate this amount is contained in **Attachment 2**.

The key recent successes of Mundaring Adult Creative & Learning Centre KPI's include:

 Securing Significant Funding: The Centre was successful in obtaining a substantial Lotterywest Grant for \$120,499.50 and a "Stronger Communities" grant for \$13,200.00. They also secured funding through the "Powering Communities" initiative for increasing solar panel capacity.

- Completing Building Expansion: Using the secured grants, the Centre undertook and completed the expansion of two studio spaces funded by the Lotterywest grant at the end of Term 4 / 2024. Stage one of constructing an outdoor learning pavilion was also planned and funded by the Stronger Communities grant. These expansions were initiated due to strong membership and classes running at capacity.
- Expanding Program Offerings: The Centre consistently introduced new programs and classes each reporting period, including subjects like Watercolour Painting Intermediate, Move Into Wellbeing, Mindful Meditation, Microsoft Office Word, Eco Dyeing & Printing, Excel for Beginners, Mixed Media Masterclass, Art Journaling, Watercolour 102, Bahasa Indonesia, Drawing & Painting Studio Time, and Clay Sculpture Studio Time. They also consistently ran specialist classes in conjunction with "Building Friendship" for people with special needs, even increasing the frequency over time. New weekend workshops were also a regular feature.
- Maintaining High Class Delivery Rates: The Centre achieved a very high percentage of classes offered actually running, consistently meeting or exceeding their target of 80%. In several periods, 100% of offered classes ran.
- Attracting New Members: Mundaring Learning consistently exceeded its target of a minimum of 10 new members per year. For example, they enrolled 68 new members across Term 1 and 2 in 2023, 45 new members in Jul-Dec 2023, 45 new members in Jan-Jun 2024, and 35 new members in Jul-Dec 2024.
- Successful Fundraising Efforts: The Centre consistently exceeded its minimum annual fundraising target of \$5,000. Fundraising income significantly contributed to their financial sustainability, allowing them to employ part-time office staff. Key fundraising activities included the Op Shop (later named "Frock n Flippers"), Book Sales, Plant Sales, Workshops & Events, and Room Hire.
- Strong Volunteer Engagement: They successfully maintained and grew their volunteer base, including Committee members, Tutors, and Op Shop/Book Store volunteers, consistently meeting or exceeding the target of a minimum of 20 active volunteers.

Providing funding through a service agreement with Mundaring Adult Creative and Learning Inc. directly links to key strategy outcomes outlined in the Shire of Mundaring Council Plan 2024-2034. As an adult community education provider, MAL contributes significantly to the Sustainable Communities key performance area. Their continued delivery of adult learning programs helps achieve

- Objective 3.2: Grow participation in arts, culture and community events and also aligns with the Sustainable Economies area by supporting

To establish an average financial benefit Mundaring Learning brings to the Mundaring economy each year, the following premise has been applied:

Assumption 1 - 50% of members who live outside Shire of Mundaring will make a purchase while at the centre. $2023 \text{ Average} = 74 \text{ members } \times 50\% = 37 \text{ members}$

Working on the above assumptions, Mundaring Learning brings 37 members spending on average \$62.00, 20 times per annum would equal

37 x \$62.00 x 20 = \$45,880

The above is an estimation only. If we were to rely on anecdotal information as discussed around the centre, the number of members and the frequency they shopped locally while attending the centre, the numbers would be much higher. We have assumed lower numbers to ensure the outcome was not over inflated.

PURPOSE

To adopt an updated Bushfire Area Access Strategy (BAAS) (Attachment 1).

BACKGROUND

A review of the BAAS is a priority project (2.3.3) of the Council Plan.

Past relevant works include:

1. 2009 - Shire of Mundaring, Community Safety Access Audit (reviewed 2015)

"Following the disastrous fires and loss of life in Victoria in 2009, community concerns were raised regarding areas of Mundaring where residents could be locked into an entrapment situation as some locations have only one access and escape path, which could become impassable in the event of fire". The initial work involved an audit of the road network where 130 potential entrapment points were highlighted throughout the shire.

2. 2016 - Shire of Mundaring, Bushfire Area Access Strategy

"In 2009, the Shire's Community Safety team completed an access audit, which identified areas that did not provide two alternative routes for residents to evacuate in a bushfire emergency. The aim of the Shire's 'Bushfire Prone Area Access Strategy' (BAAS) is to establish a framework to systemically rectify these [130] unsatisfactory access arrangements."

3. 2017 - Shire of Mundaring, Emergency Road Access Improvement Program

In response to the Bushire Prone Area Access Strategy (2016) a summary of fifty-six locations with restrictions were identified that could be addressed by the Infrastructure Services team. All simple works involving removal of obstructions were completed and another thirteen of these locations were also upgraded to meet widths set within Bushfire Design Guidelines standards. A number are awaiting additional attention. This is an ongoing program for which \$200,000 per annum is set aside in the 10 year capital programs of the Long-Term Financial Plan.

4. 2018 - Department of Fire and Emergency Services, Bushfire Risk Management System

This is a software system supporting the Bushfire Risk Management Program, a statewide program led by the Rural Fire Division to reduce bushfire risk in WA. The system enables the identification and risk rating of assets, through which a local Bushfire Risk Management Plan is developed. This Plan continues to facilitate access to financial support through the Mitigation Activity Funding Grant Program.

5. 2023 - Department of Planning, Lands and Heritage (DPLH), Bushfire Areas Vehicular Access Strategy 2023 (draft)

"State Planning Policy 3.7 Planning for Bushfire Prone Areas and Planning for Bushfire Prone Areas Guidelines identify that the vehicle network is to allow for the community to evacuate to a suitable destination before a bushfire arrives at the site, while allowing emergency services personnel access to attend the site/hazard. Where the public road access to the subject site is via a no-through road, the access recommended is to be a maximum of 200 metres from the subject lot/s boundary to an intersection where two-way access is provided". DPLH data, gathered whilst utilising the Shire of Mundaring for a pilot project, highlighted 244 potential entrapment points (some of which were already captured through the Shire's original BAAS). The Policy isn't retrospectively required; however, it highlights best practice.

The BAAS review was considered in the context of these past works, updated audit and State Planning Policy 3.7 – Planning in Bushfire Prone Areas and associated guidelines, which prescribe requirements for vehicle networks in bushfire-prone localities.

STATUTORY / LEGAL IMPLICATIONS

Under the Local Government Act 1995, section 3.21, it states in part that:

"In performing its executive function, a local government, so far as is reasonable and practicable, is to ensure that the lawful use of a land, thoroughfare or premises is not obstructed and any reasonable request that a person makes to avoid such obstruction is met."

As such local governments do have responsibility in the management of thoroughfares and ensuring, where practicable access by vehicles can be provided including access/egress in emergency situations.

POLICY IMPLICATIONS

Nil.

FINANCIAL IMPLICATIONS

Funding of \$200,000 annually is allocated across each year of the Long-Term Financial Plan to undertake the bushfire road access improvements from the BAAS. A ten-year work plan with prioritised treatments and cost estimates is in development to enable identification of individual projects across the ten year period.

Capital expenditure will ultimately be required for:

- Minor roadworks (14 locations)
- Major road connections (79 locations)

Establishment of new Emergency Access Ways and Pedestrian Access Ways (34 locations)

Whilst priority will be directed towards the highest scoring locations a cost-benefit analysis for lower-priority actions will also be done to provide quick, cost-effective projects.

There is an opportunity to secure Mitigation Activity Funding Grants and other state/federal support to assist complete projects in an earlier timeframe.

EXTERNAL CONSULTATION

Department of Planning, Lands and Heritage (DPLH) – Data was shared between the Shire and DPLH to assist with their Guide to Preparing a Bushfire Area Vehicular Access Strategy document. During this process, they assisted in identifying areas to be included based on their records and data that wasn't recently identified by the Shire.

Community/Bushfire Ready Groups - Disaster-ous Dinners were held (March to May 2024) with letters sent to 846 properties on 93 streets listed as top-priority. This resulted in 8 community events being run with 153 attendees in total, discussing the importance of having a bushfire plan and triggers to leave early, given the constraints in their egress during an emergency. Feedback was garnered to assist initial scoping of some entrapment locations.

COMMENT

The BAAS review enables the Shire to proactively improve road networks to address risks presented from bushfire entrapment and aligns with the Bushfire Risk Management System (BRMS) requirements to maintain eligibility for mitigation funding from DFES.

The Shire's Emergency Management team conducted field assessments of potential entrapment points ensuring that data was current and assessed this against past information and current policy standards.

A database (**Attachment 2 and 3**) has been created to capture all the combined local data, resulting in the identification of 340 potential entrapment points.

Where logical, roads have been grouped, resulting in 228 roads or groupings to be considered. This then provides improvement for more than just one single entrapment point.

Locations were then classified into four levels of complexity.

Simple Road Restrictions: where minor intervention/improvement is required to achieve multiple access options.

Road Connections not Formalised: where more significant capital works are required.

Access Way: Emergency (EAW) or Pedestrian (PAW)

Possible Entrapment, No Solution: where physical improvement works would be impractical and/or cost-prohibitive and where land tenure solutions may need to be devised.

A wider range of other relevant local data to than that originally collected in 2009 / 2015, was incorporated to ensure the provision of a comprehensive report update and subsequent prioritised action plan.

1.0 INTRODUCTION

Bushfire poses a serious threat to people, property and infrastructure in the Shire of Mundaring (the Shire). Landowners, the Shire and state agencies all have a duty of care to manage this risk in multiple ways from managing vegetation and fuel loads, bettering the resilience of new structures to improving access arrangements.

Avoiding potential entrapment is critical. In 2009, in response to community concerns regarding restricted escape routes following the disastrous fires and loss of life in Victoria, the Shire undertook an **Access Audit** to identify roads that did not provide two alternative routes for residents to evacuate in a bushfire emergency. The data collected was further updated in 2015 prior to the first version of the 'Shire of Mundaring Bushfire Area Access Strategy' (BAAS) being prepared and endorsed (13 September 2016).

The aim of the Shire's BAAS was, and remains, "to establish a framework to systemically rectify these unsatisfactory access arrangements", a task which has been undertaken by the Shire's Infrastructure Services team over intervening years.

In 2023 the Department of Planning, Lands and Heritage, through their Land Use Planning directorate, commenced a "Strategic Review of Land Zoned Urban in Perth North Eastern Hills", which included a desktop analysis of vehicle emergency egress within the Shire of Mundaring. One outcome of the exercise was to prepare a draft "Guide to Preparing a Bushfire Area Vehicular Access Strategy" (BAVAS). The collective data was provided to the Shire in December 2023.

After inspecting this additional data, it became apparent that it was essential to incorporate all relevant local data into the *BAAS* review to ensure a more comprehensive report update and subsequent action plan.

- 3. **2017** Shire of Mundaring, Emergency Road Access Improvement Program A summary of fifty-six locations with restrictions that could be relatively easily addressed by the Infrastructure Services team. This is an ongoing program.
- 2018 Department of Fire and Emergency Services (DFES), Bushfire Risk Management System
 - This software system supports the Bushfire Risk Management Program, a statewide program led by DFESs Rural Fire Division to reduce bushfire risk in WA. The system enables the identification and risk rating of assets, through which the local Bushfire Risk Management Plan is developed. This Plan continues to facilitate access to financial support through the annual Mitigation Activity Funding Grant Program.
- 2023 Department of Planning, Lands and Heritage (DPLH), Bushfire Areas Vehicular Access Strategy 2023 (draft)
 - "State Planning Policy 3.7 Planning for Bushfire Prone Areas and Planning for Bushfire Prone Areas Guidelines identify that the vehicle network is to allow for the community to evacuate to a suitable destination before a bushfire arrives at the site, while allowing emergency services personnel access to attend the site/hazard. Where the public road access to the subject site is via a no-through road, the access recommended is to be a maximum of 200 metres from the subject lot(s) boundary to an intersection where two-way access is provided". DPLH data, gathered whilst utilising the Shire of Mundaring for a pilot project, highlighted 244 potential entrapment points (some of which were already captured through the Shire's BAAS).
- 6. **2023** Main Roads WA, Road Classification Local traffic counts plus arterial, class and criteria scores.

The locations are classified into four levels of complexity.

- 1. **Simple Road Restrictions:** where minor intervention/improvement is required to achieve multiple access options.
- Road Connections Not Formalised: where more significant capital works are required.
- 3. Access Way: Emergency (EAW) or Pedestrian (PAW).
- Possible Entrapment, No Solution: where physical improvement works would be impractical and/or cost prohibitive and where land tenure solutions may need to be devised.

The Strategy Statements that follow will guide the implementation of the BAAS.



2.0 STRATEGY STATEMENTS

- Access improvement priorities will be based on a risk management approach which
 aims to deliver genuine gains in community safety and brings access into accordance
 with *Guidelines for Planning in Bushfire Prone Areas* Version 1.4, December 2021,
 (the Guidelines) as much as practicable and may be staged over a period of time;
- In Simple Road Restriction scenarios, removal of any road restriction preventing vehicle through movement such as boulders, bollards or gates not formally approved through section 3.50 of the Local Government Act are to be removed as soon as practical and residents notified at least 2 weeks prior to works commencing;
- 3. In *Road Connections Not Formalised* scenarios (including unmade and proposed roads), where connections do not meet the Guidelines, treatment options meeting the Guidelines shall be developed in conjunction with residents. Where valid objections are received and modifying treatment options cannot substantially address the issues raised, the matter shall be forwarded to Council for resolution;
- 4. In Access Way (Emergency EAW or Pedestrian PAW) scenarios, where public / Shire land is available and / or already in use, and the access way does not meet the Guidelines, treatment options meeting the Guidelines shall be developed in conjunction with residents. Where valid objections are received and modifying treatment options cannot substantially address the issues raised, the matter shall be forwarded to Council for resolution;
- 5. In *Possible Entrapment, No Solution* scenarios, (where areas exist and infrastructure solutions cannot be readily achieved), the Shire will advise those landowners and encourage them to discuss informal (interim) solutions to alternative access options until such time as formal tenure changes can be established.
- 6. The **Access Audit** related to this Strategy will be dynamic and subject to regular updates;
- Capital works required to address identified locations will continue to be contained in the Capital program for Bushfire Access Improvements and budgeted within the Shire's Corporate Business Planning process;
- The Access Audit and this Strategy should be reviewed every 5 years, having regard to the access standard benchmarks set by the Guidelines, and/or any successor document;
- 9. New subdivisions will continue to be subject to achieving compliance with contemporary standards which may require the ceding of land for thoroughfares and/or a fair and reasonable contribution at the time of subdivision to improve existing non-compliant roads deemed necessary for access.

3.0 RISK MANAGEMENT PROCESS

The process of setting priorities and preferred access treatments will follow the Standard Risk Management Methodology (Australian Standards: AS/NZS ISO 31000:2009).



3.1 Context

The threat of bushfire risk is one that residents have repeatedly expressed concern about to the Shire, both directly and through Shire Community Perception Surveys.

Since 2009, a number of reviews have been commissioned following major bushfire incidents, which have included recommendations supporting the improvement of access and egress arrangements for residents in the event of an emergency.

2009 Victorian Bushfires Royal Commission

In the case of bushfires, roads and roadsides can be important fuel breaks, so road managers need to reduce the fuel levels in preparation for the fire season. Roads are also essential for people seeking to escape fires and for emergency services seeking access to fires. Since the 2009 fires land and road managers and the CFA have identified high-risk roads and are carrying out fuel-reduction work to reduce the future risks of bushfire.

A Shared Responsibility – Report of the Perth Hills Bushfire February 2011

(No. 39 (c)) "State and Local Governments [should] examine options to retrospectively bring these areas into compliance with Planning for Bushfire Protection Guidelines."

January 2016 Waroona Fire Special Inquiry

Access is mentioned in relation to traffic management during, and after, the incident. It is reasonable to conclude that multiple access options could only positively affect these processes.

Royal Commission into National Natural Disaster Arrangements 2020

12.20 It is important that accessibility [of evacuation routes] is considered in planning, and that efforts are made to ensure these routes are resilient for the purposes of a natural disaster. These routes are important not just as a means to evacuate communities, but also to provide access to communities for first responders, for the purposes of recovery and to ensure continuity of supply chains during and after a disaster.

The Guidelines) outline, amongst other things, current expectations regarding standards and design requirements for public roads and Emergency Access Routes. These public thoroughfares need to be freely available and safe for public use in the event of a bushfire.

The Shire's *Local Planning Strategy* (LPS) was endorsed by Council in February 2014, it also specifically identifies the need to improve access arrangements in established areas.

..."Much of the existing residential and rural residential development within the Shire of Mundaring, particularly in areas subdivided some decades ago, fails to meet...key [bushfire access safety] requirements, leaving many residents with potentially inadequate escape routes and emergency vehicles with inadequate access for firefighting and evacuation purposes.'

(Local Planning Strategy 2014)

The Shire has in the past, for one reason or another, physically closed or obstructed roads with gates and boulders. The Shire, as the managing authority of thoroughfares, has a legal obligation under Section 3.52 (2) of the *Local Government Act (1995)* to keep thoroughfares or streets open:

"Except to the extent that it is authorised by law to close them or restrict their use, a local government is to ensure that thoroughfares are kept open for public use."

If this provision of the *LG Act (1995)* is found to be contravened, the local government must rectify the situation so that it can resume its compliance with section 3.52(2) as soon as practical.

Since the Shire's and WAPC's adoption of the Shire's Local Planning Strategy, the State has introduced a new *State Planning Policy 3.7 – Planning in Bushfire Prone Areas* and a new iteration of the Guidelines (Version 1.4).

Hence, the Shire's BAAS is based on a set of rational, consistent and interlocking documents /statutes / recommendations that exist at both State Government and local government level which highlight the duty of care obligations the Shire has in resolving existing unsatisfactory access arrangements.

3.2 Risk Identification

To achieve genuine improvements, the Shire must direct its limited resources to best effect. The Shire manages 982 roads within the Shire, 612km of these are sealed whilst 77km remains unsealed. Some perform an important district function, while others are locally significant.

The **Access Audit** completed in 2009, and reviewed in 2015, was considered sufficient at the time to initially prioritise immediate problem areas and develop cost-effective treatment solutions.

The 2024 Access Audit followed the following process:

- 1. Inclusion of all existing data:
 - Shire of Mundaring, Community Safety Access Audit 2015
 - o Shire of Mundaring, Bushfire Area Access Strategy 2016
 - Shire of Mundaring, Emergency Road Access Improvement Program (ERAIP) ongoing
 - Department of Fire and Emergency Services, Bushfire Risk Management System (BRMS) ongoing
 - Department of Planning, Lands and Heritage, Bushfire Areas Vehicular Access
 Strategy 2023 (desktop data)
 - o Main Roads WA, Road Classification 2023
- 2. Field assessments of potential entrapment points to verify data.
- Desktop review of collated data, detailing impacted properties, identifying where the data was collected, the bushfire risk rating of the location and which stakeholders should be liaised with regard to further works.
- 4. Addition of Aboriginal Cultural Heritage information relating to each road.
- 5. Prioritisation of works through a focus on the road score (classification and traffic count) plus the number of properties impacted multiplied by the BRMS Risk Rating.

3.3 Engagement

Engagement with affected residents is critical and will promote a general understanding of the Shire's approach.

It is acknowledged that the audit should be dynamic, responding to and accommodating current concerns or situations brought to the Shire's attention.

It is important that residents are kept informed of the Shire's initiative to improve access routes around their area, both in terms of the potential nuisance or inconveniences caused by construction works, but also so they acutely aware of the improvements and any new options for escape in an emergency situation.

3.3.1 Simple Road Restriction

As identified above, the Shire, as the managing authority of thoroughfares, has an obligation under Section 3.52 (2) of the *Local Government Act (1995)* to keep thoroughfares open.

Where road restrictions have been removed no option for a permanent restriction to be reintroduced shall be considered.

Where issues result from the removal of a road restriction such as changes in traffic patterns that cause traffic issues which are confirmed through traffic surveys then traffic management treatments will be developed in consultation with residents and implemented when budgets allow. Where significant consensus cannot be reached a report will be prepared for Council resolution.

3.3.2 Road Connections Not Formalised

Where improvements relate to connecting, widening or completing portions of road and/or proposed roads in existing road reserves, the Shire will inform surrounding residents of the proposed works and the preferred treatment.

Where various treatment options are available, the Shire will invite comment from landowners to help inform the preferred treatment solution. As well as informing residents, inviting comment could potentially enrich the Shire's understanding of the challenges in the locality and identify some cost-effective alternatives.

Where significant consensus cannot be reached on the treatment option a report will be prepared for Council resolution.

3.3.3 Access Way (Emergency EAW or Pedestrian PAW)

Where improvements relate to widening or completing designated Access Ways, the Shire will inform surrounding residents of the proposed works.

Where various options are available, the Shire will invite comment from landowners to help inform the preferred solution. As well as informing residents, inviting comment could potentially enrich the Shire's understanding of the challenges in the locality and identify some cost-effective alternatives.

Where significant consensus cannot be reached on the selected option a report will be prepared for Council resolution.

3.3.4 Possible Entrapment, No Solution

This category covers public roads with only one formally gazetted entry point or where improvement works would be impractical and/or cost prohibitive and where land tenure solutions may need to be devised.

Resolution of high difficulty improvements will require strong collaboration between landowners and the Shire. In most instances, the Shire will be unable to achieve any improvement without landowners actively participating and (in some cases), accepting some tenure burden (easement/public road reservation) over freehold land.

It is not within the financial capacity of the Shire to compulsorily acquire private land for the purpose of thoroughfares, nor does compulsory acquisition always succeed.

Hence, the Shire will only be able to create new thoroughfares through a subdivision process. The LPS and LPS4 primarily contain provisions to guide new subdivision and developments. They also contain provisions which provide for existing areas. For example, Clause 6.5.17 states:

Where...subdivision would result in improved vehicular access and safety for adjacent or surrounding residents within the Bush Fire Hazard Special Control Area and where vehicular access in that area has been recognised as inadequate by appropriate experts, the Shire may recommend approval to the proposed subdivision, notwithstanding that such subdivision is not otherwise supported by the Scheme.

The normal subdivision process has the potential to facilitate dedication of road reserves, road construction and access solutions in existing problem areas. Additional subdivision potential will not be entertained for non-compliant areas where normal subdivision rights could otherwise resolve the access issues.

Where landowners in areas without subdivision potential express an interest in subdivision, the Shire will consider facilitating subdivision provided it delivers broader access improvements, amongst achieving other planning objectives within Local Planning Scheme No.4. The Western Australian Planning Commission determines subdivision application and any outcome would need to fulfill the WAPC's expectations.

The Shire will write to the affected landowners identified as 'serious concern' and encourage discussions between neighbours to agree on some interim and 'informal' access arrangements in the event of a bushfire.

3.4 Risk Analysis and Evaluation

Priorities for access improvements will be based on the considerations below. Given that the consequence of entrapment could be life threatening, the 'Consequence' rating remains at 'Catastrophic' in all instances. Whilst every life is precious, there is a need for the Shire to take a utilitarian approach and consider the 'number of residents' at risk, as this would obviously increase the priority.

Assess the Access Difficulties / Entrapment

- Number of residents potentially exposed.
- Road hierarchy.
- Bushfire risk rating, as calculated by DFESs BRMS.

3.5 Risk Treatment

Risk treatment options need to be appropriate and cost effective based on the potential benefit. Genuine gains in community safety are more important than bringing all Shire roads and thoroughfares into absolute compliance with the Guidelines. Where practicable, the Shire will endeavour to bring improvements into accordance with the Guidelines. Noting resource constraints this will occur over the longer term.

It should be acknowledged that opening roads offers broader benefits relative to ease of access. This treatment can, by virtue of more through traffic and removal of vegetation, impact on established amenity or the local community's perception of amenity in the locality. Notwithstanding this, amenity is a secondary consideration relative to preserving life and allowing for safe evacuation in the event of a bushfire.

The following criteria will be considered in the assessment of risk treatment options, prior to inclusion within the Shire's annual budget adoption process, with an emphasis on cost-effectiveness and long-term benefits:

- Compliance with Public Road Standard Guidelines
- Adherence to current Guidelines for Planning in Bushfire Prone Areas
- Potential for a staged implementation or response
- Alternative 'Acceptable Solution' responses, considering:
 - Environmental impacts
 - Social impacts
 - Ongoing management costs
- Feasibility of implementation, including tenure and cost considerations
- Interim risk mitigation actions
- Consultation outcomes (where appropriate and undertaken)

3.6 Monitoring and Review

The Strategy will be reviewed biennially to highlight any refinements, improvements or key learnings.

The Access Audit should be regarded as a dynamic document, where there is potential for new access risks to be added and a risk rating / treatment option applied.

4.0 IMPLEMENTATION

The schedule of prioritised road and access way works will be considered annually during the budget development process.

In some cases, landowners/developers must fund the upgrading of roads and access ways to realise subdivision potential and fulfil conditions of the subdivision approval. These improvements may relate to upgrades or improvements identified as a priority within BAAS. Depending on the scale of the subdivision, the contribution could be the full amount or a portion of the total works. The Shire's schedule may not align with landowners/developers' immediate expectation, resulting in a private subdivision unable to be finalised for some time.

Re-scheduling Shire works to align with developer requests is generally not supported but may be justified where the overall cost borne by the Shire (and ratepayers) is effectively subsidised by a developer contribution.

Landowners/developers who cannot proceed with subdivision due to unsatisfactory road access or no constructed public road available to proposed lots have the following options:

- 1) Postpone the subdivision until the Shire upgrades or constructs the road according to the schedule specified; or
- 2) Contribute to the full cost of constructing the road and associated infrastructure. (Note, this may be the normal expectation where no road reserve exists in accordance with WAPC Development Control Policy 1.1); or
- 3) Commit to providing a financial contribution to the Shire and seek approval to elevate its priority within the Shire's works schedule.

In rescheduling road improvements, the following will be considered:

- Implications on community safety in postponing the scheduled/committed work;
- b. The degree to which works benefit the safety of wider community;
- Opportunity presented in the landowner/developer partially funding the road and the potential saving to the Shire in bringing the works forward;
- d. The Shire's ability to:
 - partially fund the works within the budget;
 - dedicate resources to undertake/oversee/supervise the works;
- e. The quality and reliability of the costing process undertaken and risks associated with other matters (environmental, servicing, soil type, tenure etc).

Regardless of any decision made by any other authority, the Shire will not, and cannot, be bound to fund access improvements to facilitate private subdivision.

In summary, the implementation of the reviewed Strategy will occur as follows:

- 1. Council endorses the reviewed Bushfire Area Access Strategy;
- 2. Infrastructure Services investigates prioritised works and maintenance;
- 3. Planning Services implements a process to ensure ongoing awareness of where subdivisions can positively impact existing limited access roads;
- 4. Community Safety monitor and update the Access Audit;
- 5. Following consultation, the preferred treatment option will be determined by the Shire unless valid objections* are made that cannot be substantially addressed by modifying or selecting an alternative treatment option. Where valid objections are raised that cannot be readily addressed by modifying the treatment approach, the matter will be referred to Council for determination.

* Valid objections

A valid objection must:

- have a basis in the principles and considerations expressed within this strategy;
- relate specifically to the implications of the proposed treatment option or suggest alternatives, as retaining the status quo (ie non-compliant access) cannot be entertained;
- not be based on amenity considerations alone, as bushfire safety is paramount;

Examples of invalid objections may include:

- Suggestions which would fall outside of the intent of the Element 3 Vehicular Access (Acceptable Solutions / Performance Principle) within Guidelines for Planning for Bushfire Prone Areas;
- The perceived loss of property value; and,
- The loss of amenity.

PURPOSE

The Delegations Register has been reviewed for the 2024/25 financial year and is presented to Council for consideration and adoption (**Attachment 1**).

BACKGROUND

Delegations provide an appropriate level of authority to the CEO and committees of Council to undertake effective and timely day to day statutory functions and to allow Council to focus on strategic planning and decision-making and community leadership. Effective delegations promote accountability and facilitate efficient service delivery to the community.

Sections 5.18 and 5.46 of the *Local Government Act 1995* (the Act) require that a register of delegations be maintained and reviewed at least once each financial year.

STATUTORY / LEGAL IMPLICATIONS

Council may delegate

Section 5.42 of the Act enables Council to delegate to the CEO the exercise of any of its powers or the discharge of any of its duties under the Act, subject to the limitations prescribed in section 5.43. In accordance with section 5.46 of the Act delegations are to be reviewed by the delegator at least once every financial year.

Section 5.16 of the Act provides for the delegation of some powers and duties to certain committees of Council, subject to the limitations prescribed in section 5.17.

Other legislation, such as the *Bush Fires Act 1954*, the *Planning and Development Act 2005*, the *Food Act 2008*, the *Building Act 2011*, the *Dog Act 1976* and the *Cat Act 2011*, enables Council to delegate specific functions and duties to employees, usually through the CEO.

Sections 5.74 to 5.76 of the Act require an employee, to whom a duty or power has been delegated under the Act, to lodge an annual return by 31 August each year.

CEO may delegate/authorise

Section 5.44 provides that the CEO may delegate powers and duties to other employees (included where applicable under 'CEO's sub delegation to'). Section 9.10 provides for the appointment of authorised persons by the CEO.

In addition to covering delegations, section 5.45 states that nothing prevents a local government from performing any of its functions by "acting through" a person other than the CEO, or a CEO performing any of his/her functions by acting through another person.

The meaning of "acting through" is not defined in the Act, but it is generally accepted that where a person has no discretion in carrying out a function, that function can be undertaken by "acting through".

Introduction

The Delegations of Authority contained in this manual are made to the Chief Executive Officer pursuant to section 5.42 of the *Local Government Act 1995* (the Act) and to Committees pursuant to section 5.16. Where listed some of these functions are delegated by the Chief Executive Officer to Shire of Mundaring employees pursuant to section 5.44 of the Act. All delegations made by Council must be by **absolute majority** decision.

The Act provides that the following are decisions that cannot be delegated to the Chief Executive Officer (s. 5.43):

- Any power or duty that requires a decision of an absolute majority or 75% majority of the local government.
- Accepting a tender which exceeds an amount determined by the local government.
- Appointing an auditor.
- Acquiring or disposing of any property valued at an amount exceeding the amount determined by the local government.
- Any of the local government's powers under sections 5.98, 5.98A, 5.99, 5.99A and 5.100 of the Act.
- Borrowing money on behalf of the local government.
- Hearing or determining an objection of a kind referred to in section 9.5.
- The power under section 9.49A(4) to authorise a person to sign documents on behalf of the local government.
- Any power or duty that requires the approval of the Minister or the Governor.
- Such other duties or powers as may be prescribed.

Furthermore the following regulations prescribe powers and duties which cannot be delegated to a CEO:

- Regulation 18G of the *Local Government (Administration) Regulations 1996* prohibits the delegation to a CEO of the powers and duties under:
 - (i) Sections 7.12A(2), 7.12A(3)(a) and 7.12A(4) of the *Local Government Act* 1995 (relating to meetings with auditors); and
 - (ii) Regulations 18C and 18D (relating to the selection and appointment of CEOs and reviews of their performance).
- Regulation 6 of the Local Government (Financial Management) Regulations 1996 prohibits the delegation of the duty to conduct an internal audit to an employee (including a CEO) who has been delegated the duty of maintaining the local government's day to day accounts or financial management operations.

The Act allows for the Chief Executive Officer to delegate any of their powers to another employee, this must be done in writing. These powers cannot, however, be further sub-delegated (s. 5.44). The Act also allows the delegator to place conditions on any delegations if required.

A register of delegations, being this manual, is to be kept and reviewed at least once every financial year.



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If a person is exercising a power or duty that they have been delegated, the Act requires them to keep records relating to the exercise of the power or discharge of the duty. The written record is to contain:

- How and when the person exercised the power or discharged the duty; and
- The persons or classes of persons, other than council or committee members or employees of the local government, directly affected by the exercise of the power or the discharge of the duty.

Each instrument of delegation in this register describes the function being delegated and the relevant statutory reference which is the source of power for the exercise of the function. Also included is a reference to related documents such as policies of Council, which may provide guidance in the exercise of the delegation.







Delegation of certain powers and functions of the Western Australian Planning Commission relating to the Metropolitan Region Scheme

Preamble

Under section 16 of the *Planning and Development Act 2005* (the Act) the Western Australian Planning Commission (the WAPC) may, by resolution published in the *Government Gazette*, delegate any function to an officer of a public authority or to a local government, a committee established under the *Local Government Act 1995* or an employee of a local government.

In accordance with section16(4) of the Act, a reference in this instrument to a function or a power of the WAPC includes and extends to, without limitation or restriction, any of the powers, privileges, authorities, discretions, duties and responsibilities vested in or conferred upon the WAPC by the Act or any other written law as the case requires.

Resolution under section 16 of the Act (delegation)

On 24 May 2017, pursuant to section 16 of the Act, the WAPC resolved -

- 1. To delegate to local governments, and to members and officers of those local governments, its functions in respect of the determination, in accordance with Part IV of the Metropolitan Region Scheme, of applications for approval to commence and carry out development specified in clauses 1 and 2 of Section A, within their respective districts, subject to the conditions set out in clauses 1 to 4 of Section B.
- 2. To delegate to the Managing Director, Policy, Planning and Investment Transport, of the Department of Transport, and the person or persons from time to time holding or acting in that office, its functions in respect of the determination, in accordance with Part IV of the Metropolitan Region Scheme (MRS), of applications for approval to commence and carry out development specified in clause 3, Section A, subject to the conditions set out in clause 5 of Section B.
- 3. To revoke its delegation of powers and functions to local governments and the Department of Transport as detailed in the notice entitled "DEL 2015/02 Powers of local governments and Department of Transport (MRS)" published in the Government Gazette on 18 December 2015, to give effect to this delegation.

PLANNING AND DEVELOPMENT ACT 2005 INSTRUMENT OF DELEGATION

SECTION A - Types of Development

Development on zoned land

Applications for development on land zoned under the MRS except -

- a) where the land is subject to a resolution under clause 32 of the MRS; or
- b) where the land is subject to the declaration of a planning control area under Section 112 of the *Planning and Development Act 2005*; or
- c) where that land is partly within the development control area described in section 10 of the Swan and Canning Rivers Management Act 2006 or is outside the development control area but abuts waters within the development control area; or
- d) where the local government is of the opinion that the application should be determined by the WAPC on the grounds that the proposal is of State or regional importance or is in the public interest; or
- e) in respect of public works undertaken by public authorities.

2. Development on regional road reservations

Applications for developments on or abutting land that is reserved in the MRS for the purpose of a regional road.

SECTION B - Conditions

Referral requirements for development on land within or abutting a regional road reservation

The following applications for development on land that abuts or is fully or partly reserved as regional road reservation (classified as Category 1, 2 and 3) shall be referred to Main Roads WA (MRWA) or the Department of Planning (DoP) as applicable, for transport planning related comments and recommendations before being determined by the local government subject to the process explained in clause 4, Section B.

Type of regional road reservation in the MRS	Classification on plans SP 693 (PRR) and SP 694 (ORR)	Referral Agency
Primary Regional Road (PRR)	Category 1, 2 and 3	Main Roads WA
Other Regional Road (ORR)	Category 1, 2 and 3	Department of Planning

The regional road network (PRR and ORR) changes periodically with amendments to the MRS. This clause relates to all regional road reservations in the MRS as amended from time to time. Regional roads subject to this notice and the relevant agency that is responsible for their planning are shown on accompanying editions of plans SP 693 (PRR, MRWA) and SP 694 (ORR, WAPC).

The road categories shown on plans SP 693 (PRR) and SP 694 (ORR) classify the regional roads based on $-\,$



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- a) the permissible vehicular access arrangements to the subject land via the regional road frontage
 - Category 1 road means that frontage access is not allowed (control of access);
 - Category 2 road means that frontage access may be allowed subject to approval; and
- b) the legibility and statutory powers of current road land requirements defined for the purpose of regional road reservation in the MRS
 - Category 3 road means that the subject regional road reservation is not accurately defined or is subject to a review by the agency that is responsible for planning of the regional road.

"Category 1 road" applies where regional roads -

- a) are constructed or planned to a fully controlled and grade separated freeway standard; or
- b) are constructed or planned to an access controlled arterial standard, i.e. functioning as Primary Distributor or Integrator Arterial (District Distributor) road with widely spaced signalised intersections or roundabouts, and a few, if any, direct access points to individual sites or local streets.

"Category 2 road" applies where regional roads -

- a) are constructed or planned to a partially access controlled arterial standard, (i.e., a primary or district distributor road with direct connections to local streets and driveways to larger sites, but with some restriction of direct frontage access to individual properties); or
- b) have direct frontage access to abutting properties due to historic development of the road and properties.

"Category 3 road" applies where regional road reservation is not accurately defined or is under review.

For enquiries and assistance regarding -

- b) ORR Category 1, 2 and 3 call Department of Planning on (08) 6551 9000.

a. Referral requirements for development on land abutting the Swan River Trust Development Control Area

Applications for development on land that is outside the development control area but abutting land that is in the development control area, or which in the opinion of the local government are likely to affect waters in the development control area, shall be referred to the Swan River Trust for comment and recommendation before being determined by the local government.

b. Referral requirements for development on land abutting other reservations

Applications for development on land abutting land reserved in the MRS for purposes other than regional roads or Parks and Recreation (where the reservation corresponds with the Swan River Trust development control area and is covered by Clause 2, Section B of this notice) shall be referred to the public authority responsible for that reserved land for comment and recommendation before being determined by the local government.

In the case of land reserved for the purpose of Parks and Recreation, which is not vested or owned by another public authority, the applications shall be referred to the Department of Planning before being determined by the local government.

c. For the purpose of this Instrument of Delegation

- Where an application is referred by the local government to a public authority for comment and recommendation, the public authority shall provide comment and recommendation, if any, within 30 days of receipt of the application. If no comment or recommendation is received within that 30 day period the local government may determine the application on the available information.
- 2. Where the recommendation provided by the public authority specified in the delegation notice is not acceptable to the local government the application, together with the recommendations provided by all public authorities consulted and the reasons why the recommendation is not acceptable to the local government, shall be referred immediately to the WAPC for determination.
- The powers delegated to a member or officer of a local government may only be exercised by a member or officer who has been delegated power from the local government to consider and determine applications for



approval to commence and carry out development within the local government district under the local government's local planning scheme.

Interpretation

In this Instrument of Delegation, unless the context otherwise requires –

- A reference to a 'position' or 'classification' contemplates and includes a reference to its successor in title.
- "access" means both entry and exit from either a road or abutting development by a vehicle.
- "Commission" or "WAPC" means the "Western Australian Planning Commission".
- "development" has the same meaning given to it in and for the purposes of the Planning and Development Act 2005 or "development means the development or use of any land including –
 - a. any demolition, erection, construction, alteration of or addition to any building or structure on the land;
 - b. the carrying out on the land of any excavation or other works;
 - c. in the case of a place to which a Conservation Order made under section 59 of the Heritage of Western Australia Act 1990 applies, any act or thing that –
 - i. is likely to change the character of that place or the external appearance of any building; or
 - ii. would constitute an irreversible alteration of the fabric of any building".
- "DoT" means the Department of Transport.
- "local road" means a public road other than a private road or a road subject of reservation under Part II of the MRS.
- "not acceptable" means that the local government wishes to determine the application, as a delegate of the WAPC, in a manner that is inconsistent with the recommendation received from the public agency to which the local government was required to consult under this Notice of Delegation.
- Main Roads WA means Main Roads Western Australia.
- "regional road" means any road under the region Scheme as follows –
- land coloured red in the Scheme Map Primary Regional Roads; and
- land coloured dark blue in the Scheme Map Other Regional Roads.
- "reserved land" means land reserved under Part II of the MRS.
- "road reservation" means land reserved for the purposes of a regional road in the MRS.
- "significant increase in traffic" means generating more than 100 vehicle trips in the peak hour and would therefore require a transport assessment to accompany the development application. Refer to the Commission's *Transport Impact Assessment Guidelines*.

In accordance with section 16(4) of the Act, a reference in this instrument to a function or a power of the WAPC includes and extends to, without limitation or restriction, any of the powers, privileges, authorities, discretions, duties and responsibilities vested in or imposed on the WAPC by the Act or any other written law as the case requires.

Resolution under section 16 of the Act (delegation)

On 19 March 2020, pursuant to section 16 of the Act, the WAPC RESOLVED -

- A. TO DELEGATE to local governments, and to members and officers of those local governments, its powers and functions under section 15 of the *Strata Titles Act 1985* as set out in clause 1 of the Schedule, within their respective districts, subject to the conditions set out in clause 23 of Schedule 1:
- B. TO DELEGATE to local governments and to members and officers of those local governments, its powers and functions under sections 21 and 22 of the *Strata Titles Act 1985* as set out in clause 2 of Schedule 1, within their respective districts, subject to the conditions set out in clause 3 of Schedule 1;
- C. TO AMEND "Del 2020/01 Powers of Local Governments" to give effect to its resolution and to publish an updated, consolidated instrument.

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Schedule 1

1. Applications made under section 15 of the Strata Titles Act 1985

Power to determine applications under section 15 of the *Strata Titles Act* 1985, except those applications that –

- a) propose the creation of a vacant lot;
- b) propose vacant air stratas in multi-tiered strata scheme developments;
- c) propose the creation or postponement of a leasehold scheme;
- d) propose a type 1 (a) subdivision or a type 2 subdivision (as defined in section 3 of the *Strata Titles Act 1985*):
- e) in the opinion of the WAPC as notified to the relevant local government in writing, or in the opinion of the relevant local government as notified to the WAPC in writing, relate to
 - i. a type of development; and/or
 - ii. land within an area,

which is of state or regional significance, or in respect of which the WAPC has determined is otherwise in the public interest for the WAPC to determine the application.

2. Applications under sections 21 and 22 of the Strata Titles Act 1985

Power to determine applications under -

- a) section 21 of the Strata Titles Act 1985;
- b) section 22 of the *Strata Titles Act 1985* where the amendment or repeal of scheme by-laws requires the approval of the WAPC.

3. Reporting requirements

A local government that exercises the power referred to in clause 1 and/or clause 2 is to provide WAPC with data on all applications determined under this Instrument of Delegation. This must be provided at the conclusion of each financial year in the format prescribed by the WAPC.



Section 27 (4)	Vary or cancel a notice issued as per subsection (3).
Section 28 (5)	Recover the expenses of the local government incurred in extinguishing a fire where the occupier of the land on which the fire is situated has failed to take measures to extinguish it.

Section 33 (1)	Give notice to an owner or occupier of land by publishing a notice in the Government Gazette and in a newspaper circulating in the district requiring the installation and maintenance of fire breaks and to take other specified actions in relation to anything on the land which is conducive to the outbreak of a bush fire or the spread or extension of a bush fire.
Section 33 (4)	Direct a bush fire control officer, or any officer of the local government with required workmen or contractors to enter upon the land of an owner or occupier who fails or neglects to comply with the notice issued as per subsection (1) to carry out the works required.
Section 33 (5)	Ascertain and fix the amount of any costs incurred in carrying out works as per (4) and recover same in a court of competent jurisdiction as a debt due from the owner.
Section 33 (6)	At the request of the owner or occupier of land within its district, carry out on the land, at the expense of the owner or occupier, any works for the removal or abatement of a fire danger, and recover the amount of the expense, if not paid on demand, from the owner or occupier in a court of competent jurisdiction.
Section 38 (1) and (2A)	Appoint such persons as considered necessary to be bush fire control officers including a Chief Bush Fire Control Officer and a Deputy Chief Bush Fire Control Officer and cause notice of such appointments to be published at least once in a newspaper circulating in the district.






Year to Date Revenue Actuals Compared to Annual Budget



STATUTORY / LEGAL IMPLICATIONS

- (1) If the local government has delegated to the CEO the exercise of its power to make payments from the municipal fund or the trust fund, a list of accounts paid by the CEO is to be prepared each month showing for each account paid since the last such list was prepared
 - (a) the payee's name:
 - (b) the amount of the payment;
 - (c) the date of the payment; and
 - (d) sufficient information to identify the transaction
- (2) A list prepared under sub regulation (1) or (2) is to be
 - (a) presented to council at the next ordinary meeting of the council after the list is prepared; and
 - (b) recorded in the minutes of that meeting

Regulation 13A of the *Local Government (Financial Management) Regulations* 1996 states:

- (1) If a local government has authorised an employee to use a credit, debit or other purchasing card, a list of payments made using the card must be prepared each month showing the following for each payment made since the last such list was prepared
 - (a) the payee's name;
 - (b) the amount of the payment;
 - (c) the date of the payment;
 - (d) sufficient information to identify the payment.

- (2) A list prepared under subregulation (1) must be
 - (a) presented to the council at the next ordinary meeting of the council after the list is prepared; and
 - (b) recorded in the minutes of that meeting.

REASONS

Cr Ellery has provided the following reasons for this motion:

• "Main Roads has advertised the speed limit changes to one of the most dangerous intersections in the Shire:

Mundaring Council and the community were not consulted prior to advertising this change

- The change will likely defer any upgrades to the intersection as advocated f or specifically in our advocacy position
- As the intersection already has a speed limit of 70km/h, it is highly questionable that this change will improve conditions whilst deferring needed intersection changes."

Outcome 4.1 - Facilitate improved community safety.

OFFICER COMMENT

Shire staff were advised by a Main Roads WA speed zoning officer of a review of speed limits on Great Eastern Highway between the rail bridge, Midvale and Sutcliffe Road, Mundaring (14.1km length) on 2 April 2025 ahead of a proposed meeting that Main Roads WA were having with the WA Transport Minister and Dr Colin Hughes.

The review went through;

- 1. Recorded crash history over the length of the 14.1km road section covering the period 1 January 2019 to 31 December 2023.
- Braking heatmap providing locations of hard braking thus indicating spots of near misses. This is a new investigative tool through a license with Compass IoT where data is collected from 64 brands of cloud connected vehicles.
- 3. Curve surveys which indicate a safe driving speed for each curve both eastbound and westbound.
- 4. Operational speeds for the 85th percentile covering five different road sections (rail bridge to Greenmount Rise, Greenmount Rise to Bilgoman Road, Bilgoman Road to Grancey Avenue, Grancey Avenue to Chipper Street, Chipper Street to Sutcliffe Road).

As a result of these investigations the section between Greenmount Rise and Lionel Street was identified as the most problematic clearly having the highest recorded crash data, highest braking heat map and with four roads curves where the safe driving speeds were between 70 km/hr and 80 km/hr.

Based on these investigations the Main Roads WA officer concluded their presentation advising that based on these investigations they were contemplating a recommendation to lower the speed limit between Lionel Road and Greenmount Rise from 80 km/hr to 70 km/hr to address the identified road deficiencies. This review it was noted still needed to go through senior levels at Main Roads WA so was not a determined position.

Shire officers heard no more until becoming aware through the Main Roads WA website that the change in speed limit as contemplated had progressed to an approval. Advice on the website notice was sought from the Main Roads WA speed zoning officer was contacted whom advised that no consultation on the approved change was to occur and a communication plan was under development.

Main Roads WA are the statutory authority for establishing speed zones and erecting and maintaining speed limit signs and will consult with Local Governments on speed zones for local roads. In this case, Great Eastern Highway is a declared main road being the

responsibility of Main Roads WA. No formal consultation or feedback is typically undertaken in these instances.

In relation to the proposed intersection upgrades, a recent update on the investigations by Main Roads WA into the safety upgrade options for Scott Street and Great Eastern Highway has indicated the various options are under internal review with costings for each option and 3D modelling prepared. They hope to present to the findings to the Shire for discussion by end of June.

COMMENT

The *Local Government Act 1995* in Western Australia has undergone changes concerning the appointment of presiding members and deputy presiding members for committees. Instead of committee members electing these roles, the council now appoints them by absolute majority. This change applies to all current and new committees, including Audit Committees, with the deadline for existing committees being July 1, 2025.

This report does not seek to nominate new presiding/deputy members, rather seeks to confirm and re appoint existing presiding and deputy members through Council resolution to the appointments that were previously made by the committees.

The Committees, Advisory Groups, Representatives Meetings and Working Groups Policy will be reviewed to align with the legislative change and brought back to a future Council meeting.

The Terms of Reference for affected committees will also be amended to reflect this new statutory requirement. This will occur to coincide with the October 2025 local government elections, when Council reviews all terms of reference to ensure they remain relevant to the operations of the committees, working groups etc.

The Australia Day Citizenship Awards Committee is not included in this report, as it is not due to meet until December 2025, and this will be after the 2025 Elections. New members and presiding officers will be appointed from the new Council after elections.
