

## FORM 3 - APPLICATION FOR ENVIRONMENTAL ASSETS INSPECTION

This form is used to request a Shire Environmental Officer to visit your property and identify key environmental assets in or near a proposed development. If you are considering earthworks, building or other development within 30m of a creek line, near significant trees, native vegetation or a granite outcrop, it is best to request a site visit before you lodge an application for planning approval. Key environmental assets and issues can then be taken into account from the beginning, before you invest more time and money into plans for the property.

*Please note that this service is limited to Environmental Assets Inspection only. The Environmental Officer cannot give planning advice or complete a flora or fauna survey for you.*

The Environmental Officer will usually not spend any longer than 30 minutes on site. They will take notes and mark key environmental assets issues on a site plan or aerial photo, then take these notes and maps back to the office to finalise.

The quickest and simplest way to provide you with the Environmental Officer notes and maps after the site visit is by email, however we can post it out if you prefer.
