Hi everyone,

I’m pleased to announce that award-winning Cox Architecture has been appointed to design the Shire’s new Mundaring Cultural Hub—a project set to transform the heart of Mundaring! Leading the design is Cox Director and Darlington resident Matthew Batchelor, who brings international credentials and deep local knowledge. His connection to the region, combined with Cox Architecture’s community-centred approach, ensures the final design will reflect our values and aspirations. The project is fully funded, including a \$15 million Thriving Suburbs Grant from the Labor Federal Government—a significant investment in our Shire’s future.



The Federal election campaign has also brought some exciting commitments for our Shire’s projects. Liberal and National Party candidates have pledged more than \$9 million in upgrades and infrastructure, including:

- Major improvements to changerooms and sporting facilities at Mundaring Sports Club, Brown Park in Swan View, and Glen Forrest.
- \$1.25 million to boost telecommunications resilience through backup power at mobile towers.
- \$3.9 million for facilities at six local Volunteer Bush Fire Brigades, including \$1.6 million for Parkerville and further funding for Glen Forrest, Wooroloo, Darlington, Chidlow and Mt Helena.

We welcome these commitments and hope to see more vital funding secured from all candidates in the final weeks of the election campaigns.

As ANZAC Day approaches, I invite everyone to join us at one of the many services held across the Shire to honour the courage, resilience, and sacrifice of our soldiers and to reflect a strong ANZAC spirit and commitment to remembrance. Lest We Forget

Resubscribe to Bushfire SMS service

We recently discovered a technical issue with our SMS messaging system that stopped an update about the change from Prohibited to Restricted burning from being delivered.

As part of a recent system upgrade, some subscriber details were lost, which means if you were previously receiving SMS alerts for Fire Danger Ratings, Fire Bans or Burning Periods, you’ll need to resubscribe to keep getting these important messages.

We want to reassure you that your personal information has not been accessed or compromised.
