At Council, we're currently finalising the 2025 - 26 Budget, with a strong focus on delivering projects that matter to you. Priorities in our Capital Works Program include new changerooms for Mt Helena, Boya and Glen Forrest sporting facilities, upgraded lighting at Brown Park, and a brand-new Pump Track in Glen Forrest, to name just a few.

In response to community feedback, Councillors have endorsed a feasibility study and business case to explore options for new or improved aquatic facilities across the Shire, including Bilgoman, Mt Helena and Wooroloo. The study will consider a range of possibilities - such as extending the swimming season and help identify sustainable solutions for the future.

We're excited to share early plans for a new Caravan Rest Stop in Chidlow, thanks to an election commitment we secured. Designed to welcome more visitors to our beautiful Shire, the project will be open for community consultation in July/August. We're keen to hear your feedback when the design and location are released.

A New Chapter for Community Learning



Shire of Mundaring has reaffirmed its commitment to community learning, renewing a four-year service agreement with Mundaring Adult Creative and Learning Inc. (MACL).

The funding valued at \$39,500 per year (plus CPI), supports MACL's delivery of inclusive and accessible adult education programs across the shire.

With more than 45 years of service, the volunteer-led organisation offers a diverse timetable of classes including digital literacy, painting, wellbeing, and specialist programs for people with additional needs.

Shire President Paige McNeil said the renewed agreement highlights Council's focus on lifelong learning and community connection.

"MACL continues to inspire a culture of learning in our community. Their programs are a testament to the value of local, volunteer-driven education," she said.

Recent achievements include securing over \$130,000 in external grants, expanded facilities, and strong growth in membership and volunteering. The agreement also supports 'Our Plan for the Future', the Shire's Council Plan 2024 to 2034 by promoting wellbeing, arts and culture and volunteering.
