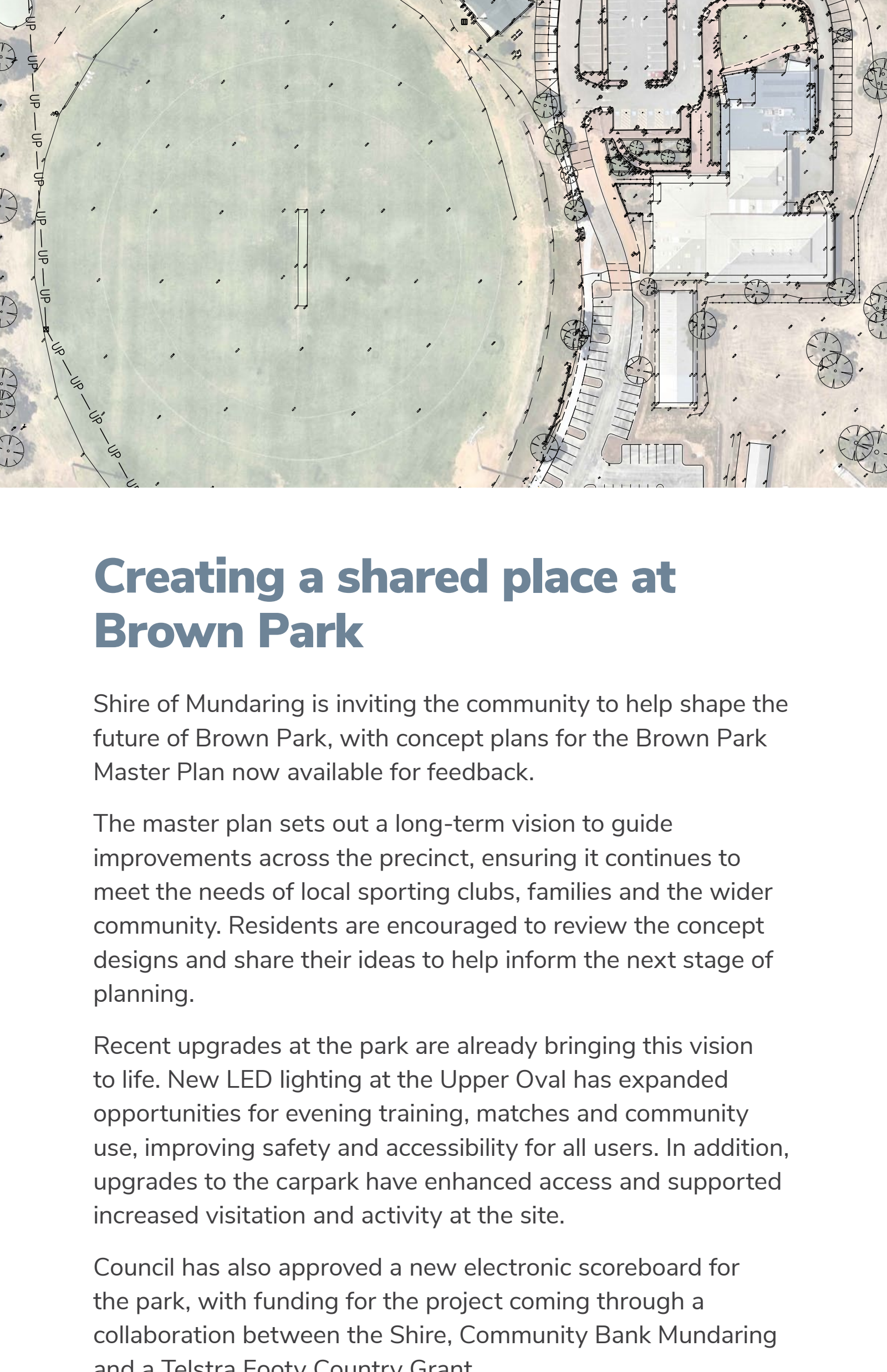

## Creating a shared place at Brown Park

Shire of Mundaring is inviting the community to help shape the future of Brown Park, with concept plans for the Brown Park Master Plan now available for feedback.

The master plan sets out a long-term vision to guide improvements across the precinct, ensuring it continues to meet the needs of local sporting clubs, families and the wider community. Residents are encouraged to review the concept designs and share their ideas to help inform the next stage of planning.

Recent upgrades at the park are already bringing this vision to life. New LED lighting at the Upper Oval has expanded opportunities for evening training, matches and community use, improving safety and accessibility for all users. In addition, upgrades to the carpark have enhanced access and supported increased visitation and activity at the site.

Council has also approved a new electronic scoreboard for the park, with funding for the project coming through a collaboration between the Shire, Community Bank Mundaring and a Telstra Foxy Country Grant.

These improvements are part of a staged approach to delivering the broader master plan, with more enhancements to come.

## Major changeroom upgrade begins at Elsie Austin Oval

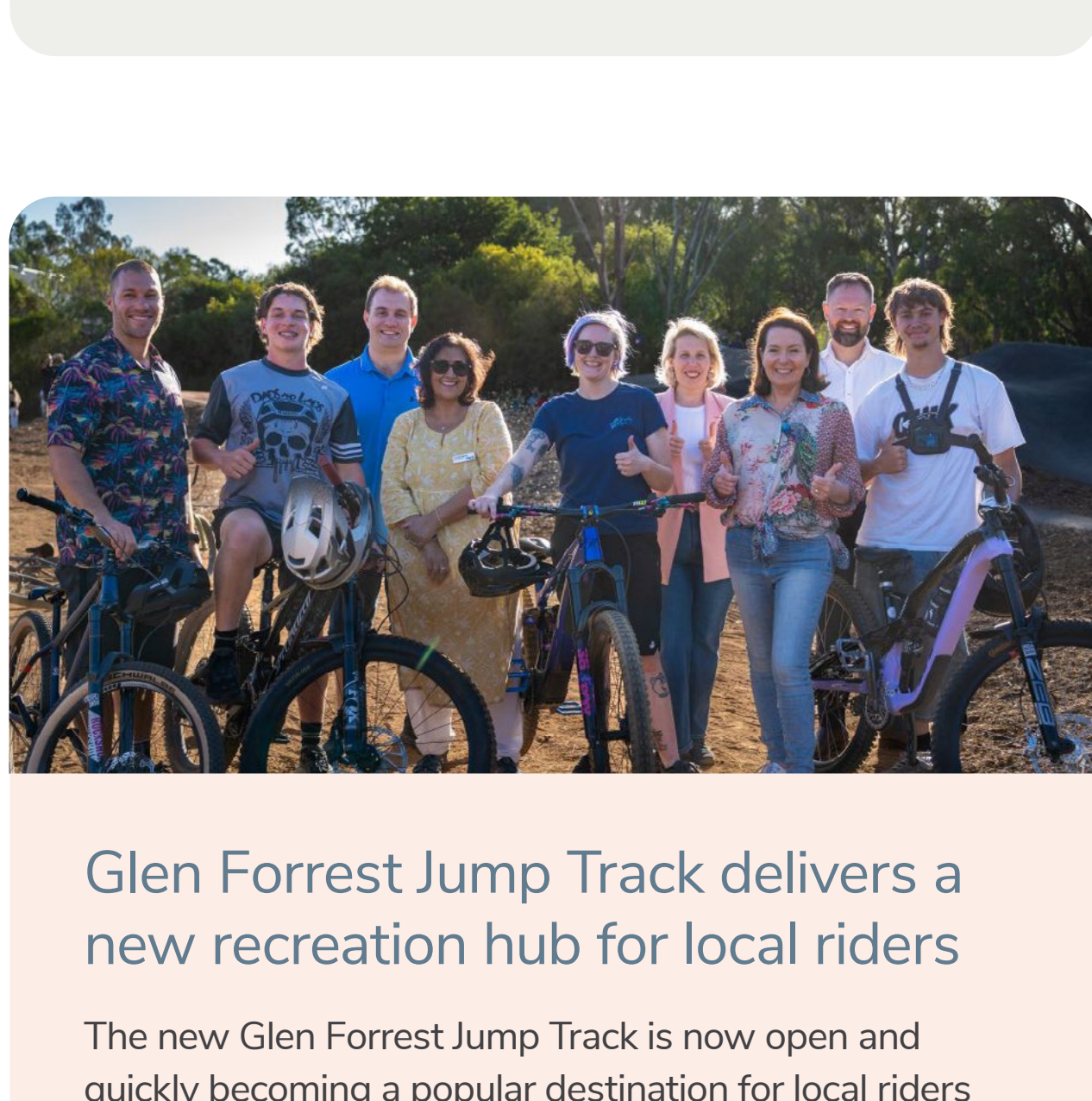
Upgrades to the Elsie Austin Oval changerooms in Mount Helena are now underway to deliver improved facilities for local players, clubs and the wider community.

The project will modernise the changerooms to better support female participation, increase accessibility and provide more inclusive, functional spaces for all users. Enhancements will include upgraded amenities, improved layouts and facilities designed to meet the needs of our growing and diverse sporting community.

These improvements reflect the Shire's ongoing commitment to supporting local sport and creating welcoming, accessible spaces that encourage participation at all levels.

The upgrades are due for completion in Mid 2026.

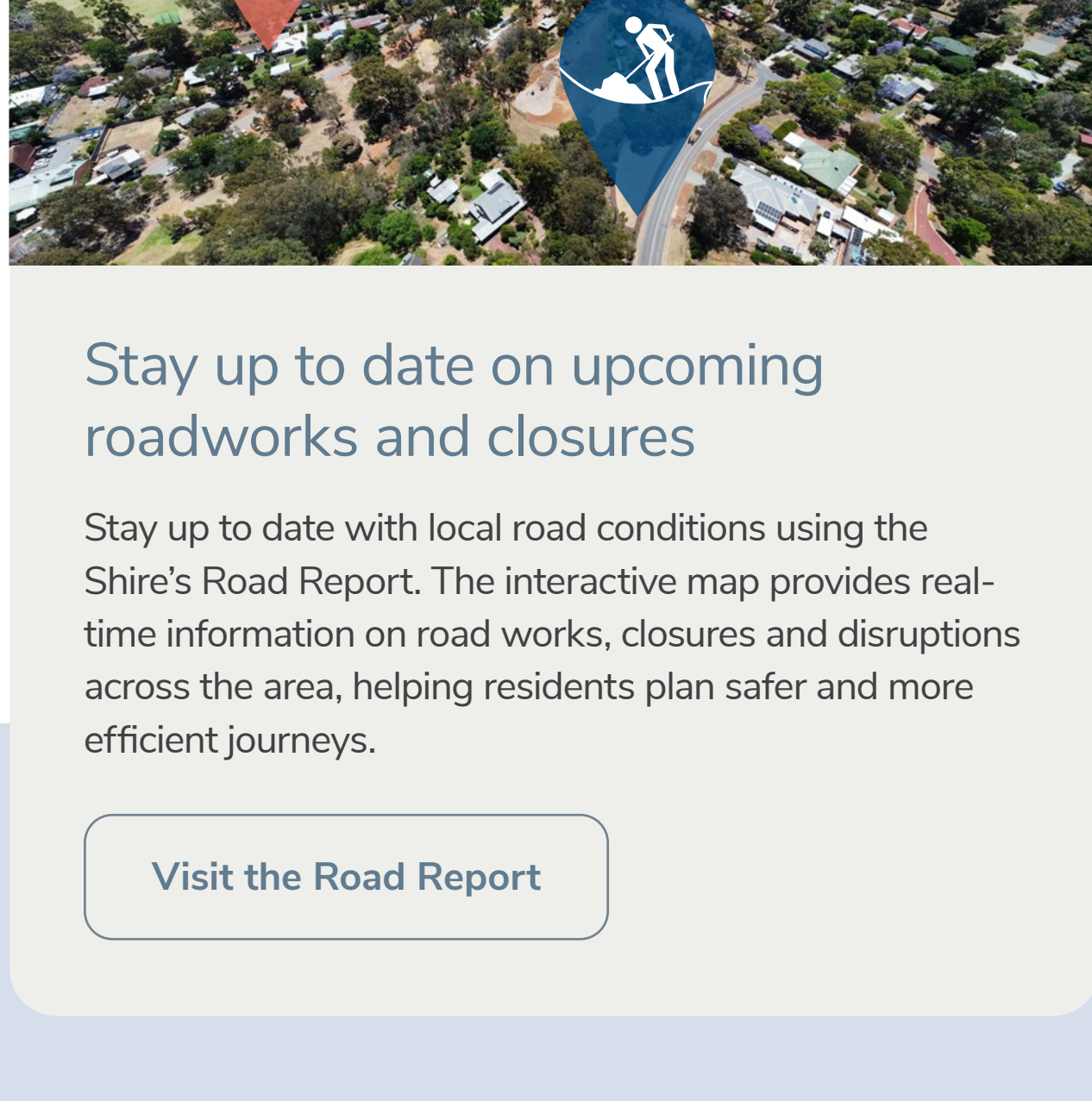
## Fraser Park Playground set for exciting upgrade

Families in Greenmount will soon enjoy a refreshed and more engaging play space, with the Fraser Park playground set to receive a much-anticipated upgrade.

The project will see the existing playground revitalised with new equipment and improved features designed to support active, imaginative and inclusive play for children of all ages and abilities. The upgrades aim to make the park a more welcoming destination for local families and visitors alike, encouraging outdoor activity and community connection.

## Brooking Road Extension & Falls Road Bridge Replacement project progressing

Planning is underway for a major infrastructure project in Parkerville, with the Brooking Road Extension and Falls Road Bridge Replacement set to improve safety and local traffic flow.

The Brooking Road Extension will create a new, more direct connection between Owen Road and Richardson Road, helping to improve access for residents and emergency services while easing pressure on surrounding local streets. The project also includes a new bridge crossing over Jane Brook, upgraded pedestrian links, and safety improvements at key intersections.

As part of the works, the ageing Falls Road timber bridge will be replaced with a modern box culvert structure, supporting safer and more reliable access for the community.

Environmental considerations, including stormwater management and tree planting, are also central to the project design.

The project is currently in the planning and community consultation phase, with further engagement opportunities available for residents. Construction is expected to progress through staged works, with completion anticipated in 2027.

## Backup generator boosts resilience at Mundaring Arena

The Shire has successfully delivered a new 337kVA backup generator at Mundaring Arena, with the 18-month project now reaching final commissioning.

As one of the Shire's designated evacuation centres for multi-hazard events, including bushfires and severe storms, Mundaring Arena plays a critical role in supporting the community during emergencies. Following recent weather events across the Perth Hills, the addition of reliable backup power significantly strengthens the facility's ability to operate when it's needed most.

The \$182,000 investment ensures the Arena can maintain essential services during power outages, including lighting, emergency systems, alarms and communications – helping to keep people safe and informed.

Beyond emergency use, the generator also supports day-to-day operations by enabling games, training and community events to continue with minimal disruption. It also protects key infrastructure and equipment from power fluctuations, while allowing amenities such as canteens, refrigeration and payment systems to remain operational.

This project represents a practical investment in community safety, event reliability and long-term resilience for the Hills.



## Glen Forrest Jump Track delivers a new recreation hub for local riders

The new Glen Forrest Jump Track is now open and quickly becoming a popular destination for local riders seeking a dedicated space to build skills, confidence and enjoy time outdoors.

Located adjacent to Morgan John Morgan Park, the \$370,000 purpose-built facility features a progressive series of jumps, rollers and flowing lines designed to cater for a range of abilities.

The project was informed by strong community and local rider input, helping to ensure the final design reflects what users wanted most: a safe, engaging and social space that encourages active recreation and an appealing alternative to screen time.

Residents are encouraged to visit, ride responsibly, and enjoy this exciting new addition to the Shire's recreational infrastructure.

## New Changing Place enhances inclusive access at Bilgoman Aquatic Centre

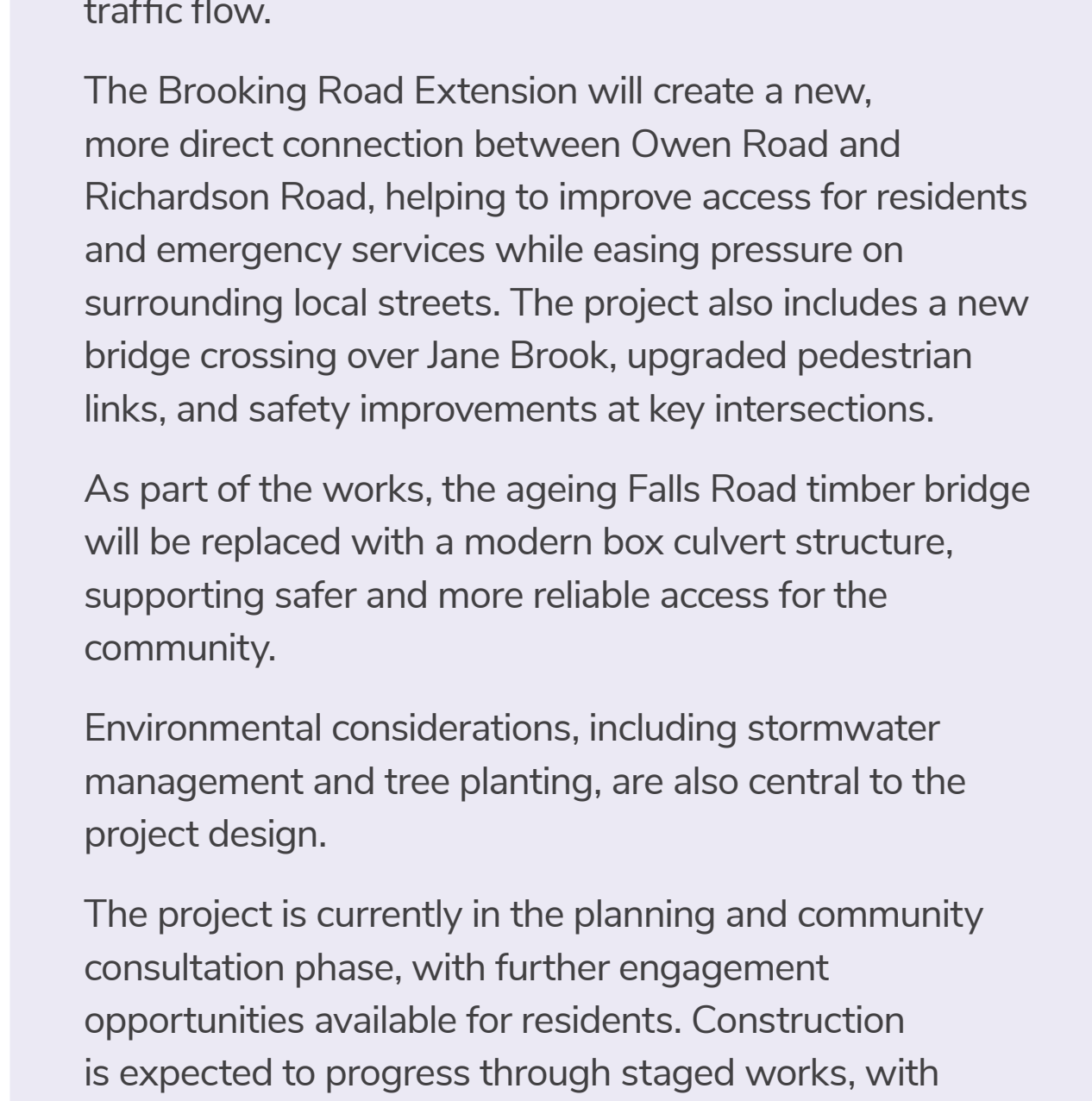
A Changing Place facility at the Bilgoman Aquatic Centre is now supporting improved access for people with high support needs and their carers, strengthening inclusion across one of the Shire's key recreation destinations.

The purpose-built facility includes specialist features such as an adult-sized change table, ceiling hoist, accessible shower and toilet, providing a safe, spacious and fully equipped environment that supports comfort, dignity and independence for users.

Now listed on the national Changing Places register, the facility enables visitors and families who rely on this infrastructure to plan their visits with greater confidence, supporting broader participation in aquatic and community recreation activities.

The addition forms part of the Shire's ongoing commitment to delivering inclusive, accessible community infrastructure and ensuring public facilities meet the diverse needs of the community.
