Another milestone reached for the Mundaring Cultural Hub

The Mundaring Cultural Hub project has reached another important milestone, with Expressions of Interest (EOI) for the design finalisation and construction of the Cultural Hub building now closed.

The EOI process was the first step in identifying experienced contractors capable of delivering this landmark community project. Following the assessment of submissions, shortlisted proponents will be invited to participate in the formal tender process.

Subject to project timelines, a construction contract is expected to be released later this year, with the successful contractor anticipated to be appointed before Christmas.

The Mundaring Cultural Hub will create a vibrant destination for arts, culture, learning and community connection, delivering a significant investment in the future of the Hills.

Exciting progress at Brown Park

The Brown Park Master Plan is continuing to take shape, with several projects now underway to enhance recreation, accessibility and community facilities across the precinct.

Construction of the new cricket nets is well underway, giving visitors a sneak peek at one of the many improvements planned for the park. A new scoreboard is also progressing, with the Swan View Cricket Club and Swan View Football Club leading the project and the Shire providing support to help bring it to life.

Planning and consultation mapping has commenced for the new enclosed dog park, while a new We-Go Swing has recently been installed to provide more accessible play opportunities for children of all abilities.

Works on the Brown Park Community Centre are also set to begin this week, with the main court temporarily closed for two weeks while the first phase of repairs is undertaken.

One of Wooroloo's most valued community spaces is undergoing a major transformation, with renovation works now underway at Wooroloo Hall.

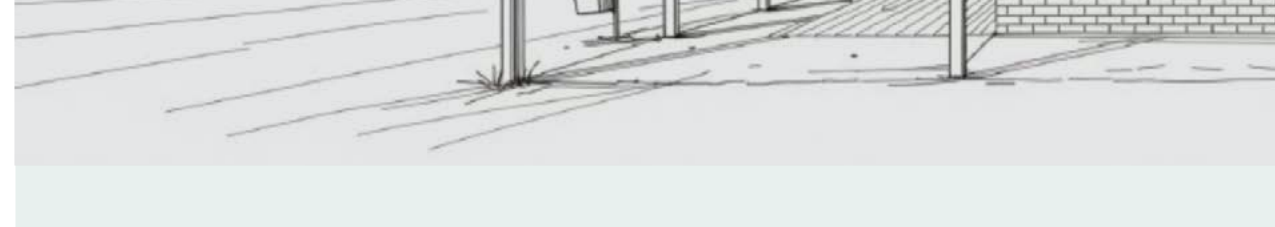
The significant upgrade will include a new roof, flooring, kitchen, toilets and improved insulation, ensuring the historic hall can continue serving local residents and community groups for generations to come.

While work is underway, the strong community spirit that defines Wooroloo remains on full display. Local group Wooroloo Craft, Chat & Cuppa, which was established following the 2021 bushfires, has temporarily relocated its weekly gatherings to the Wooroloo Bush Fire Brigade. The brigade has generously opened its doors to keep the group connected, while the Shire has provided secure storage for craft supplies.

For organiser Stephen Fox, the renovations are about more than upgraded facilities, they are about preserving an important community hub for the future.

Upgrades planned for Boya and Glen Forrest sporting precincts

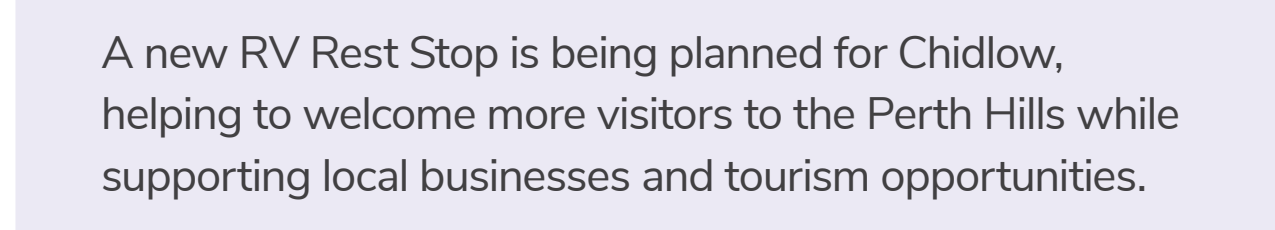

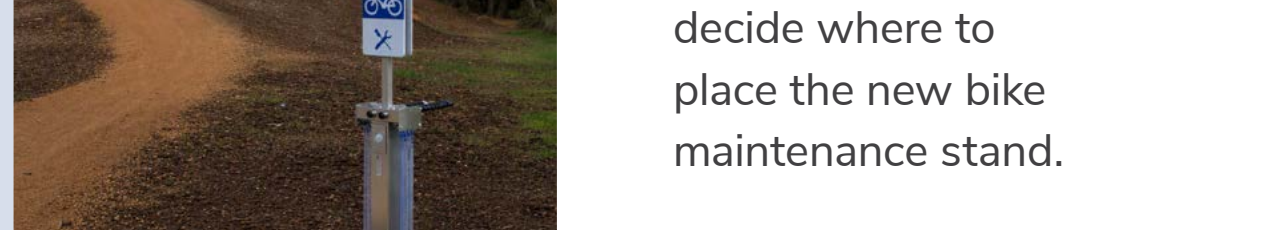
Chidlow Pavilion and Emergency Management Centre upgrade to strengthen community resilience

A major upgrade is planned for the Chidlow Pavilion, delivering a modern facility that will support both community activities and emergency management into the future. The project will enhance the existing pavilion with improved amenities, functionality, safety and accessibility, while also providing a dedicated Incident Control Centre to strengthen local and state emergency response capabilities.

The upgrade recognises the pavilion's important role as a hub for sport, recreation, events and community connections, while ensuring the facility is equipped to serve the community during times of emergency. Planning is currently underway, with construction expected to commence later in 2026.

New RV Rest Stop planned for Chidlow

A new RV Rest Stop is being planned for Chidlow, helping to welcome more visitors to the Perth Hills while supporting local businesses and tourism opportunities.

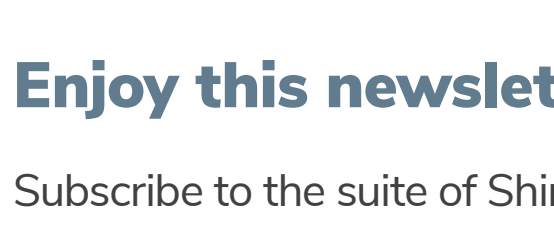
The project will provide dedicated facilities for self-contained recreational vehicles, including unpowered parking bays and a wastewater dump point, addressing a recognised gap in local RV infrastructure. The new facility is designed to encourage travellers to spend more time exploring Chidlow and the wider Shire, while improving services for visitors passing through the region.

By creating a safe, accessible and convenient stopover location, the project aims to strengthen Chidlow's reputation as a welcoming destination and support the goals of the Shire's Economic Development and Tourism Strategy.

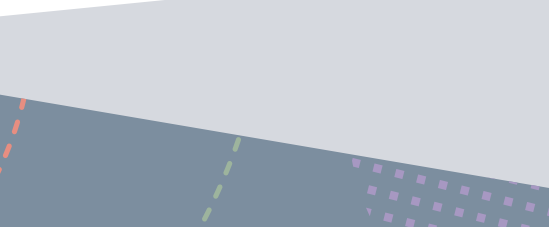


Help the Glen Forrest Jump Track community decide where to place the new bike maintenance stand.
